Welcome to Maple Bluff's Country Club



I'm sure you've noticed all the improvements going on up at Maple Bluff Country Club, including the work the Village is doing on the Lakewood entrance. The reason the Village is paying for and supervising the entrance work is because of our unique relationship with the club. Since the Village owns the land and improvements and leases them to MBCC, both parties understand how much we mean to each other's success—financially and socially. The improved entrance is symbolic of the warm welcome the club and Village are making to all members and Village residents.

You may have already received something in the mail outlining what the lease refers to as “Resident Privileges.” But I like to think of them as part of an automatic “resident membership” each of our families receives as soon as we move into the Bluff. No matter how you refer to it, it's another reason that the Village is such a special place to live.

It includes (check the mailing for details):

- Participation for your kids on the Maple Bluff Swim, Dive and Tennis teams—as well as swimming lessons

- Use of the restaurant, reception, tennis courts and golf course three times a year.
- Use of the entire grounds for winter sports like sledding, snowshoeing, cross-country skiing and skating.
- An MBCC account (be careful about letting your kids memorize your account number—many of us have suffered “Snack Bar Shock” in a July bill).
- And if you decide to upgrade to a Social, Social Pool & Tennis, or Golf membership, you'll only have to pay half the initiation fee that may be charged for that membership level.

With the new pool, deck and fitness facility, this is the summer for all of us to make the most of whatever level of membership we have (and, hopefully, step up to one that gives us even more time to enjoy all that the club has to offer).

So, as the new entrance signifies, “Welcome.” It's Maple Bluff's country club.

Village construction projects.

Work has already started on several of the Village construction projects for this summer. Those projects include a reconstruction of the Lakewood Blvd entrance to the MBCC, the Beach tennis courts and parking lot renovation, and the installation of a crossing island near the intersection of N Sherman Ave and Roxbury Road. There may be minor traffic delays as some of this work takes place in the roadway, but delays should be minor. Be watchful for traffic pattern changes or traffic possibly being controlled by flag operators.

You should also be aware that the Village has received authorization from the US Department of Transportation to install Rectangular Rapid Flashing Beacons (RRFBs) at both the Beach and at Roxbury/N Sherman. You can see these flashers being used near the Northgate Shopping Center. When the flashers are activated, pedestrian or bicycle crossing is imminent. Parents, please discuss the operation of these flashers with your kids and strongly emphasize that they be used!

The Village Garage sale is still scheduled for May 21st. As a reminder, during the garage sale, the Village will convert Kensington Drive to a one-way street going northbound. Woodland Circle will be converted to one-way, from the south to the north.

There has been recent activity on another proposal for a development at the Roxbury Road/North Sherman Ave intersection. This condo style project, referred to as Acadia at Maple Bluff, is approximately 27 units that will have an appearance of Town Homes. The developer, Blake Griffin, is working thru final designs and economics before making formal submission to the Village. We will try to keep you informed via the Village Email list as this project moves forward. While thinking about development, the project across the street at 601 N Sherman Avenue that was approved last year has again begun construction. Work was put on hold in mid-December as winter approached, but with spring here, construction has resumed. The Developers Agreement for that project requires this construction to be completed before the end of this year.

There are a lot of spring and summer activities happening around the Village. Please call the Village Center if you have questions or concerns regarding any of the projects, activities, or events that will be taking place.

Update from TID Advisory Committee

The Tax Incremental District (TID) Advisory Committee was formed by the Village Board to develop recommendations that support the implementation of the Village's TID plan. If you would like more information on what TID plan is; a detailed article was written on page four of the April Newsletter.

The TID Advisory Committee has met 4 times since formed on February 9th. To best represent the village and develop recommendations, we decided to create a ScoreCard that developers could use to objectively assess their proposal against the voice of the village. The ScoreCard has been developed with the Roxbury Sherman parcels as the focus.

The debate has been honest, lively and practical. The goal is to strike the right balance between the desires of the village, the immediate neighbors and developers. The committee has worked hard to strike that balance while taking into account many perspectives.

The first draft of the ScoreCard was completed on April 13th. Our next task will be to perform a second pass over the ScoreCard. Once it is complete we will send it out to the village by email for review, and hold a listening session shortly thereafter. As you review the ScoreCard, we would encourage you to look at the ScoreCard as a complete document versus analyzing single lines. We look forward to completing the ScoreCard and to hearing from you at one of the listening sessions. Dates for the listening sessions will be included when the ScoreCard is distributed.

Finally our mild winter has reluctantly given way to spring like weather!!

All of us have been outdoors doing spring chores for weeks in weather that really didn't seem able to make up its mind. It feels good to set aside the winter apparel and enjoy the warming sun and get outdoors to experience the green up of spring! Time to rediscover yards and gardens again!

As with every spring in the village, there is much to do in an ever increasingly crowded time space; construction projects; yard waste collection; pier installation; sidewalk replacement; tree removals/maintenance/replacements along with our usual chores!


Please be aware of and plan accordingly for a construction project that will be addressing the Lakewood entrance to the MBCC; beach parking lot; and tennis courts. This will be a very busy section of the village for the next several weeks when considering there is also a large scale project underway at the MBCC. Both projects are to be substantially if not totally finished before Memorial weekend!! I would like to recommend that if you and your service providers can avoid this corridor for the next month or so, please do. If not, realize that you are navigating through a construction zone with equipment and workers performing their tasks. So please drive defensively; slow down; expect delays and be safe!!

We have removed several ash trees this spring and will likely remove more yet this year as time allows. The approach of EAB (emerald ash borer) for the past 10-12 years has been to remove ash trees that have been damaged or have hazards associated with poor structure or is showing poor health and vigor. During this same time frame we have not planted any ash. As with many communities, Maple Bluff also over-planted ash trees after the elms where preyed upon by Dutch Elm Disease back in the late 70's. An opportunity was missed at that point to strengthen the urban forest from insects and disease by planting a wide variety of tree species. Choosing the green ash as the primary replacement of the elm tree was a critical mistake. Not only is the ash likely to succumb to the EAB, but they were also a tree that often displays poor structure and growing tendencies. Due to the traits of the green ash, I am recommending removal versus treatment. There are a few white ash in village right of ways that have far better growth characteristics that are worthy of a treatment attempt. I would highly recommend property owners to assess all of your trees regularly with a service provider you are confident and comfortable with. Realize that treatment of an ash should only be done to trees that are in excellent condition.

An Arbor Day celebration recognizing Maple Bluff as a Tree City and Bird City community is scheduled for May 7th, starting a 10am. Location for the event will be Johnson Park where we will have information and demonstration programs for trees and birds alike. Hope to see you there!!

Frequently Asked Questions About The Veterans Memorial



Who is behind this memorial?

A group of interested citizens, including Maple Bluff veterans, have spent over two years planning the memorial. The committee is independent of the Village, however, contributions for the memorial are tax deductible when made payable to the Village of Maple Bluff. No Village funds are being used for the construction of the memorial. Upon completion the memorial will be turned over to the Village of Maple Bluff.

Where will it be located?

In Johnson Park west of the Gazebo on the small knoll. The approximate location of the site has been marked with five red, white and blue stakes.

What veteran's names are included on the memorial?

Any present, past or future veteran who has lived in Maple Bluff, before, during or after his or her service will be included. Their name and dates of service or conflict will be included. Names will be etched on black granite panels. There will be extra panels for future Bluff residents. The special black granite comes from the Bangalore area of India near the quarry where the stone for the Viet Nam Memorial was quarried.

Who do I contact to get a veterans name added to the memorial?

What will it cost?

Approximately \$150,000. One third of the cost is for the black granite panels with the veterans' names, one third for excavation and backfill, concrete and stone work, and one third for benches, landscaping, electrical, flag poles, bronze medallions etc.

How will it be funded?

Contributions from Maple Bluff residents and interested parties, plus \$10,000 of Bocce money raised by the Village Parks and Recreation Committee at previous Bocce Bash events. Contributions of any amount will be gladly accepted. For those who wish their contributions recognized on the brick walk leading to the memorial, two donation levels include a brick paver. Contributions of \$250 or more include an 8" x 8" brick paver. Contributions of \$1,500 or more include a 16" x 16 inch brick paver. These bricks are for donor recognition and have space for four or eight lines of copy that can be used to recognize family members, events, important dates, etc. As of April 19th, the committee has raised \$19,000.

When will the monument be built?

The committee wants all of its funding to be in place before starting construction. Once we have the donations needed to purchase the custom black granite panels, they will be ordered from abroad. Cutting, shipping, and engraving of veterans' names will take several months.

How do I make a contribution for the Veterans Memorial?

Contributions of any amount should be delivered or sent to the Village of Maple Bluff, 18 Oxford Place, Madison, WI 53704. Please add a note that the contribution is for the Maple Bluff Veterans Memorial. All contributions payable to the Village of Maple Bluff are tax deductible.
