Maple Bluff Police Department

August 2026

The information provided below summarizes some of the incidents that officers responded to over the past month. Please note that most narratives reflect initial and preliminary details gathered by personnel in the field at the time of the incident. As investigations progress, the facts, circumstances, and even the classification of the incidents may change.

08/01/2026: Traffic Arrest, 6:19 PM – An MBPD Officer conducted a traffic stop on a vehicle for a registration violation. During the traffic stop, the 44-year-old male driver was found to have a revoked driving status due to a previous OWI, as well as a requirement to have an Ignition Interlock Device (IID) installed in any vehicle operated by him. No IID was installed in the vehicle. Additionally, the driver was on probation for Possession with Intent to Distribute Cocaine and had a special rule not to drive without a valid license. Due to this violation, the Wisconsin Department of Corrections (DOC) was contacted and placed a probation hold on the driver. The driver was taken into custody on the probation hold and additionally charged with Operating After Revocation due to OWI/refusal and Operating Without IID Required.

08/01/2026: Recovered Stolen Vehicle, Arrest, 8:23 PM – An MBPD Officer received information from a reliable law enforcement tool that a stolen vehicle was traveling toward Maple Bluff. The vehicle was located in the City of Madison, and a high-risk traffic stop was conducted. The sole occupant and driver of the vehicle was taken into custody without incident and identified as a 58-year-old male. The vehicle was found to be stolen out of Columbia County, Wisconsin. The driver was unable to be booked into the Dane County Jail due to medical issues, and charges for Operating a Vehicle Without Owner's Consent were referred to the Dane County District Attorney's Office.

08/02/2026: Traffic Stop, Recklessly Endangering Safety, Weapons Arrest, 12:39 AM – An MBPD Officer observed a vehicle driving on Aberg Avenue near Huxley Avenue with no lights on during hours of darkness, creating a public safety concern. A traffic stop was conducted on the vehicle, and three male subjects exited the vehicle and began running. Another MBPD Officer arrived and gave chase to one of the suspects. Upon catching up to the suspect, a 23-year-old male, a physical struggle occurred when the suspect attempted to access a firearm concealed in his waistband. The firearm was later identified as stolen. The officer was ultimately able to stabilize the subject and take him into custody. The officer who initiated the traffic stop gave chase to another subject who fled from the vehicle on foot. That suspect was observed tossing a firearm while running. The officer was able to apprehend the 25-year-old male after a short foot chase.

The subject apprehended after the struggle was booked into the Dane County Jail on charges of Possession of a Firearm by a Felon, 1st Degree Recklessly Endangering Safety, Resisting / Obstructing, Carrying a Concealed Weapon, and Receiving Stolen Property. The other subject was booked into the Dane County Jail on charges of Carrying a Concealed Weapon, Resisting / Obstructing, and Felony Bail Jumping.



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08/06/2026: Traffic Stop, Possession with Intent to Deliver Cocaine Arrest, 2:31 PM – An MBPD Officer observed a vehicle operating with illegal window tinting. The vehicle abruptly parked on the road before the officer was able to conduct a traffic stop. The MBPD Officer contacted the 44-year-old male subject and detained him due to the belief that he had a warrant. As the investigation progressed, it was determined that the subject did not have a warrant; however, probable cause existed to search the subject's vehicle. A search of the vehicle yielded a large amount of crack cocaine and drug paraphernalia. The subject was ultimately booked into the Dane County Jail on charges of Possession of Cocaine with Intent to Deliver, Possession of Drug Paraphernalia, and Operating After Revocation due to OWI.

08/08/2026: Operating While Intoxicated Arrest, 7:23 PM – An MBPD Officer was dispatched to the 400 block of N Sherman Avenue for a report of a subject in a vehicle parked in a no-parking area who reportedly had difficulty walking and was hitting the vehicle's horn. An MBPD Officer arrived on scene, made contact with the 23-year-old male driver, and detected signs of impairment. Standardized field sobriety tests were conducted, and probable cause was established to arrest the subject for Operating While Intoxicated. The subject was issued citations for Operating While Intoxicated (1st offense) and Operating with a Prohibited Alcohol Concentration (1st offense). The subject was subsequently released to a responsible party.

08/09/2026: Traffic Stop Arrest, 4:30 PM – An MBPD Officer conducted a traffic stop on a vehicle for a registration violation. The 40-year-old male driver was identified and found to have a civil process warrant for his arrest. The subject was taken into custody and transported to the Dane County Jail. At the jail, the subject was served the appropriate paperwork by the Dane County Sheriff's Office and released from custody.

08/09/2026: Traffic Stop Arrest, 10:45 PM – An MBPD Officer conducted a traffic stop on a vehicle for registration and equipment violations. A 28-year-old male passenger in the vehicle provided the MBPD Officer with a fictitious name when asked to identify himself. The passenger then exited the vehicle and attempted to flee on foot. Another MBPD Officer was in the area and apprehended the subject after a foot chase and subsequent struggle. MBPD Officers were eventually able to positively identify the subject and confirm that he was currently on probation and had active warrants for his arrest. The subject was booked into the Dane County Jail on a charge of Resisting/Obstructing, in addition to a probation violation and multiple active warrants.

08/10/2026: Traffic Stop Arrest, 10:47 AM – An MBPD Officer conducted a traffic stop on a vehicle for a speeding violation. The MBPD Officer identified the two occupants and found that the 64-year-old female passenger had an active warrant for her arrest. The passenger was taken into custody and booked into the Dane County Jail on the warrant. The driver was issued a verbal warning for the speeding infraction.

08/10/2026: Warrant/Obstructing Arrest, 3:32 PM – An MBPD Officer was aware that a subject with multiple felony warrants was likely in the area of Woodward Drive and in close proximity to the



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Village of Maple Bluff. The MBPD Officer was on routine patrol in the 1300 block of Farwell Drive when they observed an individual on Woodward Drive near Warner Park Beach whom they believed to be the subject with multiple felony warrants. The MBPD Officer contacted the 39-year-old male subject, who provided a fictitious name. The MBPD Officer was able to positively identify the subject as the individual with the outstanding warrants. The subject was taken into custody and transported to the Dane County Jail, where he was booked on the outstanding warrants as well as one count of Resisting / Obstructing for providing the MBPD Officer with a fictitious name.

08/17/2026: Warrant Arrest, 7:28 PM – An MBPD Officer was conducting follow-up in the 900 block of Huxley Avenue regarding an active MBPD investigation. While in the area, the MBPD Officer contacted an unrelated vehicle because they had reason to believe it may have been stolen. While contacting the vehicle, the MBPD Officer observed a 17-year-old male in the back seat whom they knew to have a warrant for his arrest. The warrant was confirmed, and the subject was taken into custody. The subject was transported to the Dane County Jail and booked on the outstanding warrant. Through further investigation, the vehicle was determined not to be stolen.

08/19/2026: Resist/Obstruct Arrest, 8:38 PM – An MBPD Officer conducted a traffic stop on a vehicle for an equipment violation. The vehicle operator provided multiple fictitious names to MBPD Officers, as well as fake identification cards that the subject later admitted were fake. MBPD Officers ultimately utilized the Fast ID tool to positively identify the subject. The 48-year-old male was taken into custody and booked into the Dane County Jail on charges of Resisting / Obstructing and Forgery.

08/24/2026: Traffic Stop Arrest, 12:19 AM – An MBPD Officer conducted a traffic stop on a vehicle for a registration/license violation. The MBPD Officer contacted the driver and passenger and obtained their identification. The passenger was found to have provided a fictitious name to the MBPD Officer. The officer was eventually able to positively identify the passenger and determined that he had an active warrant for his arrest. The 43-year-old male passenger was taken into custody and booked into the Dane County Jail on the active warrant. The subject also received a municipal citation for Resisting / Obstructing for providing the MBPD Officer with a fictitious name.

08/25/2026: Fleeing/Eluding Arrest, 7:26 PM – An MBPD Officer attempted to conduct a traffic stop on a motorcycle for a registration violation and unsafe driving behavior. The motorcycle was within a large group of motorcycles riding together. When the MBPD Officer attempted to make the traffic stop, the motorcycle engaged the officer in a vehicle pursuit. The fleeing motorcycle driver and the MBPD Officer both stopped as they came upon a serious crash. The motorcycle driver, a 20-year-old male, was subsequently taken into custody and booked into the Dane County Jail on a charge of Fleeing / Eluding.

08/31/2026: Fleeing/Eluding Arrest, 12:51 AM – An MBPD Officer attempted to conduct a traffic stop on a vehicle for a registration violation and suspected impaired driving behavior, including driving in the bike lane and nearly striking curbs. When the MBPD Officer attempted to stop the



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vehicle, the vehicle engaged the officer in a vehicle pursuit. The pursuit ended when the vehicle crashed, and the MBPD Officer took the driver and sole occupant, a 13-year-old male, into custody. The investigation revealed that the vehicle the subject was driving was stolen and had not yet been reported stolen. The subject was also listed as a missing/runaway juvenile. The subject was transported to a local hospital for treatment of injuries sustained in the crash. The subject was turned over to Juvenile Reception Center staff custody at the hospital, and MBPD referred charges to the Dane County District Attorney's Office for Fleeing/Eluding, Operating a Vehicle Without Owner's Consent, and 1st Degree Recklessly Endangering Safety.
