

## Taking Place In The Village! By Tim Krueger

Before I get too far into this article, I want to give you a reminder that the 'All Village Garage Sale' will be taking place on Saturday, May 19<sup>th</sup>. I will provide more reminders on the traffic pattern for that event next month but hopefully this allows you to start planning for your garage sale!


At the time of writing this article, we just received a submission for a development at the corner of Roxbury and North Sherman Avenue. The Developer has proposed a multi-unit residential building that is compliant with the current Village zoning standards and will therefore be seeking a Conditional Use and will not be requesting transfer into a PUD (Planned Unit Development).

The Development Team will be meeting with the Village's TID Committee in April to review the proposed development against the TID Scorecard. That meeting date has not been set so stay tuned for more information. This will be a meeting that is open to the public but it will not include a public hearing.

The next stop after the TID Committee for this proposal will be at the Plan Commission. The Plan Commission will likely meet with the Developer to receive a detailed presentation about the project and they will then host a Public Hearing. The Public Hearing is an opportunity for residents or other interested persons to provide

their comments about the project. The Plan Commission will then consider those comments as they make a recommendation to the Village Board. The Village Board would take action at their next regularly scheduled meeting.

The renovation work being completed at the Beach House is moving at a good pace and is still on target to be completed before Bocce is held on June 1<sup>st</sup>. That was also a reminder that Bocce is on June 1<sup>st</sup> so get ready for sign up which will be taking place quite soon!



Do you have extra medications at your home that you no longer need or want? Or maybe your parents or siblings are keeping their own pharmacy at home? The National "Drug Take Back" program has been working to empty as many homes of non-used controlled substances as possible. The pathway to Opioid addiction is often charted thru the improper use of controlled substances, including pain pills and similar drugs. Maple Bluff Police has participated in the "Drug Take Back" program several times and we will do so again on April 29<sup>th</sup> from 9a-2p. If that date and time do not work, you are always welcome to drop off those drugs at the Maple Bluff Police Department at a day and time that is convenient for you. Please have the drugs in their original container if possible and then secured in a closed zip lock bag.

**Cool Start To Spring.** By Tom Schroeder

The calendar claims it to be spring...there appears to be plenty of robins chirping from the trees...and March didn't display any teeth from beginning to end. It's looking like we will have to be patient in receiving the warm-up associated with this time of year...Easter Sunday will struggle to get to the mid 30's. We will not be installing the piers until all of the ice is off the lake!

In spite of the cool start to spring, we have been providing curbside collections for yard waste; garden debris; leaves; sticks and branches. When placing materials on the terrace and NOT in the street, please be sure to separate these items in like groupings. We collect these materials with specialized pieces of equipment, and the material collected may have a different drop off location. I'll share with you a couple of memorable catastrophes...a chunk of firewood was in a leaf pile and the vacuum machine sucked it up and jammed the impellor and broke the crank shaft of the engine. We were out of the leaf collection business until we replaced the engine. There was also a time when a strip of metal was placed with branches and was then fed into the wood chipper...epic failure. We were then out of the wood chipping business until repairs were performed. Both instances occurred during curbside collection. We appreciate your effort to separate materials to allow for a safer environment for both operator and machine.

For trash day (every Wednesday) and recycle day (every other Wednesday) please have your containers out for collection by 6:30 am. Metals that do not conform to the recycle guidelines should be placed to the side of your containers and we will collect them separately. Keep in mind that there are many items that require a collection sticker that are available at the Village Center administration office. We do not collect clean-sweep type items. All residents of Dane County can use the Dane County Clean Sweep operation located at the County landfill across from Yahara Hills Golf Course on Hwy 18; 608-838-3212. Your trash containers are to be no larger than 30 gallons and no heavier than 50lbs. The use of containers larger than this is not compliant with Village ordinance 186-4. I request voluntary compliance from everyone, please.

We will soon be receiving a tree order that is nicely diversified. I will make every effort to provide replacement trees in a timely fashion to areas that we have recently removed ash trees. We will be continuing to remove additional ash trees as well as other hazardous/dead/declining trees as time allows and or needs demand. I feel very strongly that we will provide replacement trees at or beyond the pace of removal of trees. I am more than willing to discuss the type and location for new trees as well. Keep in mind that a healthy urban forest is a diversified forest.

Arbor Day/Bird City celebration will be April 28th. Time and location to be determined.




