# Dept. of Public Works: By: Tom Schroeder

January weather has been far less volatile than the political atmosphere. Fortunately, we have experienced a mild month with slightly above high and low temperatures and slightly below snow amounts. If its snow and cold you want, we still have plenty of our winter season to navigate. If recent history holds true for the roller coaster weather scale we usually experience, I suggest that we will likely be served a healthy dose of cold and snow before long.

As with past winter conditions, it is our goal to treat all of the intersections, hills and curves with salt and sand mix. These areas will be the first to show pavement and with time the balance of roadways will clear as well. We do not have a bare pavement policy. Keeping the roadways plowed during long duration storms minimizes the build up and allows the treatment material to be more effective toward the end of the storm.

Having mentioned snow, I would like to thank all who manage their snow removal appropriately by keeping it on property and not in the street or your neighbor's terrace.

Another thank you to all who have altered their trash container size/volume and weight. This is more important than you may think as we perform the collection by hand, as we do with most of our street side collection services. This time of year, please consider the conditions before placing odd unbagged materials such as metals or small odds and ends as they can easily become "lost" in snow and become a hazard for pedestrians/pets/bicyclists and vehicles/equipment. Even placing wood chunks that became part of the snowbank has destroyed a hydraulic pump motor on the Bobcat snow blower when we widen the roads when snow accumulates excessively.

We have had a chance to internalize and clean the shop and perform maintenance on our equipment. Taking advantage of the mid-season lull.

Expect to see a lot of action this year addressing the needs of tree removals.... there are still ash trees requiring our attention. There will be an equally important task to plant a significant number of trees this year...I much prefer planting rather than removal. Feel free to remind me of tree desires you may have.

An interview of interested applicants for an opening with the Department of Public Works will take place early February. I look forward to offering a conditional employment opportunity to one of the applicants shortly thereafter.
