#### **Spring** By Tim Krueger

April Fools! What a weird tradition. Did you get made to be a fool this year or maybe on the giving end of a good April Fools prank? I hope not, but if you received or gave a good prank that can be repeated, send me a message and I will highlight details next month.

Village staff is in busy mode as we have been preparing for spring to hit and it now seems to be just about here. It was a long winter and since we are now in April, we should be about past the last attempts for winter to return. Village parks, gardens, streets, tennis courts, marina all need attention so public works and rec department staff will be busy bringing those dormant areas back to life!

A meeting between Village staff and the contractor for the EMI Apartment building project was recently held to discuss some of the details of construction. We have not had final project approvals yet as the project is still coming before the Building Board for structure approval and the Village Board for TIF consideration, but this level of coordination with the contractor, especially on a busy City thoroughfare cannot be started too soon. As you can imagine, there will be considerable coordination that takes place with various City services such as Madison Metro Bus, City Water Utility, MMSD, City Traffic Engineering and probably others.

As details of this project continue, we will work with the contractor to define a reasonable footprint for their construction equipment. Roxbury residents must be provided access and that access will be maintained, but we may also have thru traffic on Roxbury blocked off. Those details will be communicated once final determinations are made. From the start of construction, there will be approximately 10 months of construction but as most of you realize, that construction changes as they progress with the building. We have asked the Contractor to review off-site parking availability for their crews so they are not all parking on nearby Village streets. These plans will continue as we move toward final approvals and the beginning of construction.

I will encourage you to please contact the Village Office if you have any comments or concerns about this project or about any other topics around the Village. We strive to provide an excellent level of services and that includes being open to questions or suggestions on all topics related to the Village.



#### Moderate Temps By Tom Schroeder

Spring has apparently subdued Winter in the annual jousting match that takes place this time of year. A slow teasing slide toward a more moderate and temperament weather pattern that should deliver the warm up and green up of Spring! I for one will embrace the coming season and prepare for the assignments that come with every bolder tilt of the sun.

As all of us get a chance to clean up our yards and gardens please be considerate when placing these materials for collection. The sticks and branches or brush trimmings are collected by hand and chipped. Foreign materials such as leaves/dirt/sod/rocks cannot be mixed with woody material. Leaves and light garden debris will be collected with our leaf vac. Foreign material such as sticks/branches/rocks/dirt/sod cannot be mixed with the leaves/light garden debris. That would leave rocks/ dirt/sod can be placed separately. The rocks/dirt/sod cannot have leaves/garden debris/sticks and branches mixed in. Failure to separate waste material will delay or prevent collection and could make for a hazardous condition with staff and equipment. Please be mindful on placement of debris at the streets edge on the terrace and not in the roadway; near poles/signs/mailboxes/ trees. Parked cars and or equipment of contractors will delay or prevent collections as well.

High lake and ground water levels of last year and again this spring have provided additional challenges. The lake levels have had a significant impact on the Beach Park and Marina shore lines last fall; winter and this spring. Lake Mendota is currently nearly one foot higher than target summer max. It has been going down as most of the spring melt has taken place and we have had a badly needed dry spell. If this trend continues I feel that we should be able to get the piers in place in a timely fashion.

The high ground water level has likely placed a strain on sump pump equipment. As a reminder, it is not allowed to discharge ground water via a sump pump into the sanitary system. This discharge should be out of doors. If your volume is such that it tends to pond or flows over a sidewalk and or provides a constant puddle along the street, I would encourage you to investigate alternatives. Possibly alternating the location of your discharge hose will solve a ponding issue. A long term solution could be to hard line into the storm water system. Lake front properties can direct their discharge toward the lake edge. Again, the sanitary sewer is not the answer, nor is it allowed. Give us a call to see what options may be available to you.

We will be addressing tree needs ranging from trimming to removal this spring and summer. We will also be treating several purple ash as we have for several years now. Replacement trees have been ordered and should be available for planting in the coming weeks. I would like to hear from you if you have a desire or suggestion for a type of tree and or location for a new tree.

As time and opportunity allows, we also have a few street edge storm water flow line enhancements I would like to address this year.

Positions are now being filled for summer beach lifeguards. Applications are now available and will be due no later than April 5th at 3:00pm. The Lifeguard staff is responsible for controlling the actions of the swimmers and program participants, performing appropriate rescues when required and providing CPR/First Aid when necessary. The work will also involve providing a fun, safe and educational atmosphere for summer program participants. Starting wage is \$10.00+/hr. Applicants must have current Lifeguard Certification or be enrolled in a course to be completed by June 1st. Applications can be picked up at the Village Center or from the Village's website.

- 8. Include the addresses of each student for the DNR certificate.
- 9. Address you want the text sent to if different from that on the check.


Monday Bike Trips




