Happy 2019! By Tim Krueger

The Plan Commission recommended to the Village Board their approval of a 29 unit apartment development at the corner of Roxbury Road and N Sherman Avenue. The Village Board considered this recommendation at their December meeting and it was approved. The project still needs to be reviewed by the Building Board and TIF proposals are still expected, but several major planning hurdles have now been accomplished. As this moves forward, there will be meetings between village staff, the development team and their contractor about how the construction will impact the local area, including traffic flow. As those details are established, we will continue to communicate those to residents.

I must admit, in my time with the Village, the area proposed for development has been that proverbial thorn. The site was well dormant long before I arrived in the Village, but the frustration of watching that area linger as an eyesore and then having multiple proposals come forward and get pushed back made me worry that nothing would happen. But here we are today, ready to move forward.

As we look forward to 2019, there will be a lot of focus on this development, but we have other things to accomplish as well. Another significant project to be completed is the Veterans Memorial. As you are likely aware, construction was halted in late fall with the approach of winter. We still have the plaza to be built, flag pole installations, caps to be installed over the top of the wall and of course the finish landscaping. There is a celebration being planned for the Vets Memorial in conjunction with Fest on the 4th.

Also moving into focus for 2019 is the work of the Boy Scouts in the replacement of their cabin behind the Village Center. Recent correspondence indicates that the Boy Scouts may be looking for work to begin later this summer after Camp Ya Gotta Wanna is completed. Between now and then, watch for information about this effort and how you can be helpful! As I learn more specifics or other details, I will be sure to pass them along.

Remember the Village Caucus will be held on Tuesday, January 8th at 7:00 pm.

We are very excited to bring a Winterfest Cross Country Luminary Run! Arrive promptly at 4 pm to register for the race, and don your provided glow-in-the-dark swag before we start you off on an adventurous 2-3 mile course across the rolling hills of Maple Bluff Country Club. All ages are invited to participate and we'll have loads of glow in the dark accessories for everyone! When the fastest villager crosses the finish line, we'll festoon you with your Winterfest crown; when the last, least and slowest villager has returned from the route we'll serenade the winner as he or she lights the Winterfest Torch. The torch shall remain lit until every last bit of chili is eaten and ever drop of hot chocolate drunk. That brings me to my next point!

The hotly anticipated chili cook-off will begin at 5 pm! All aspiring top-chefs (or just people who own a crock-pot) are invited to bring a pot of chili and compete for the neighborhood title of Chili Cook-off Champion. There will be outdoor fun for all as we light up the outside of the Beach House with a bonfire and winter-lights.

Public Works

2019. By Tom Schroeder

Welcome to the New Year of 2019! Having finished and survived the past year may well be some form of relief for some, and yours truly included. This recent past year provided many challenges as I suppose any year will do. I recall a point in time this summer after the heavy rains and localized flooding that I was actually looking forward to winter conditions and a sense of normalcy. December provided little precipitation along with fairly mild temperatures for the first three weeks...unlikely to be a white Christmas...lake levels are at or nearly at seasonal levels.

The mild end of year did allow for an extended yard waste collection period as we are still waiting for a substantial snowfall to take place and have everyone exchange their rakes for snow shovels. This year's fall collection provided several challenges with our equipment's availability. One of our trucks developed a fuel delivery issue and required towing to a repair center. After a lengthy diagnostic process, and an extreme repair proposal a second opinion from a different service center provided a more reasonable solution...back in operation. During this period of time (10 days) our collection capabilities were cut in half and then our leaf loader machine had an electrical melt down that burned the starter and battery cables. We took that leaf machine out of service and rotated in our other leaf loader. Aside from a starter/cables/battery it was determined that the flywheel required maintenance and in order to get to the flywheel the clutch/bearing/pressure plate would need removal and should be replaced for practical reasons...15 years in service. All was accomplished over a couple of weeks once we got the correct components. Now we have all of our leaf collection equipment on line ...all is good...not quite...our chipper developed a non-start issue. Troubleshooting identified the problem to be 3 out of 4 glow plugs had failed. Special order from the factory...of course. The chipper is back in working order. It was OK to not see much snow in December.

Please use caution when winter storms arrive as it pertains to driving and snow removal and even walking on slippery surfaces. Keep the snow on your property; not in the street or your neighbor's yard. Place trash and recycle containers at the corner of your driveway approach when snow banks begin to grow. Allow us to clear the road snow before you move vehicles onto the streets and give snow plow trucks lots of room...in the village and out too. Christmas trees will be collected weekly during January...even after.



With December of 2018 behind us I hope all of you had a great Christmas with family and friends...warmth and good cheer to start out the New Year. This time of year has provided more lasting memories for myself than any other. May we all have opportunity ...make that... take the opportunity to have experiences with family and friends that provide memories that stand the test of time.

Did you know....

Key Fob/Bathroom use at Village facilities:

The Village Board approved after hour access to the Beach House and Dailey Cabin for bathroom use by way of an electronic key fob. Key fobs can be picked up and paid for at the Village Center during business hours. Information about the program can be found on the Village's website along with the registration form. Please allow for up to 48 hours after submitting the form and making payment for the key fobs to be programmed.

Marina:

The Parks, Recreation and Board of Harbor Commissioners agreed with Village staff's recommendation to freeze the 2018 marina rates for 2019 due to the flooding and removal of the pier and hoists early in 2018. Applications were mailed in resident's property tax bills and will need to be received no later than March 8th. After the March 8th deadline, staff will begin contacting residents who are on the waiting list for space. Beach Park and Beach House projects:

If you have not had an opportunity to visit the Beach House and/or Park since the end of October, please do so. The projects at the park concluded at the end of October with a new patio, walkway to the fire pit and removal of debris built up near the service drive.

Reserving the Gym:

In order to provide the most access to our residents, the gym will NOT be available for exclusive rentals during non-school (MMSD and private school) days, this will include snow days, unless a previously established class/program has the space occupied, such as MSCR and Connie Martin's Fitness classes. We have found that by reserving the gym during non-school days it has prevented residents from using the gym.

Beach Lifeguards

Applications are now being accepted for Summer Beach Lifeguards. The Lifeguard staff is responsible for controlling the actions of the swimmers and program participants, performing appropriate rescues when required and providing CPR/First Aid when necessary. The work will also involve providing a fun, safe and educational atmosphere for summer program participants. Applications can be picked up at the Village Center and are due back no later than April 5th at 3:00pm.

Camp Ya-Gotta-Wanna Counselors

CYGW is currently seeking enthusiastic, responsible counselors to provide a safe, fun experience for participants at CYGW.
