As we pass the mid-point of 2021, I am happy to see a safe resurgence of activity in the village! In addition to several community events on the immediate horizon, we have a significant number of recreational activities taking place and home improvement work is extremely active. Increased activity can lead to increased safety concerns, so please know that staff are well poised to respond to and address issues that may arise. Ultimately, we are all appreciative for the transition to normalcy!

As you may have heard, on 30 July 2021, the Maple Bluff Country Club Swim Team is hosting the All-City Swim Preliminaries at the Club from approximately 1pm to 6pm. We anticipate the event will attract over 1500 attendees – swimmers, coaches, families, officials, sponsors, and volunteers. This influx of visitors will significantly increase vehicle and pedestrian traffic, as well as limit parking throughout the village and we are working closely with the organizers to facilitate a safe, successful, and minimally disruptive experience. Please note that we are asking contractors to avoid the village on that day to alleviate some of the traffic and parking concerns. Similarly, I ask residents to reschedule any services that could be otherwise performed on a different day. Thank you for your help!

In May's newsletter I informed you that we had several upcoming staffing announcements. Today, I am very happy to announce two new additions to our Village staff – Officer Vincent Murphy and Officer Cody Woods. Vince and Cody accepted offers to join our team as part-time Officers with the Maple Bluff Police Department. I also have the distinct pleasure to announce we promoted part-time Officer Kyle Knoeck to the rank of Detective for the Village of Maple Bluff Police Department. In addition to providing patrol coverage, Detective Knoeck performs the department's administrative and criminal investigations. His contributions are integral to ensuring successful prosecutions and maintaining crime deterrence in our community.

Significant Strides By: Tom Schroeder

Collectively we have made significant strides toward normalcy in the last couple of months. It is good to see faces once again! As for normal business as usual? Not quite yet...it will take a while for suppliers of goods and services to get back to speed. It seems that nearly everything is backordered from computer chips to ductile water main pipe. What will the price tag look like when the bill demands to be paid?

The Public Works Department is getting back to normal for the most part. The past year has been full of staffing reductions of one form or another. From working with reduced staffing levels...a resignation...protracted hiring process...paternity leave. Even our part-time workers had restrictions on their availability. We are moving in the right direction...toward normal.

Top on our list of activities is providing collection services village wide each week for the collection of yard waste (leaves; garden debris; brush) early in the week and trash collection on Wednesdays. Next on our list has been addressing the infested ash trees along with any other hazardous tree conditions we find. Most of our tree work has been done on Thursday and some time Friday. Park maintenance is also done on Thursday or Friday. Gardening and trimming park trees are addressed when time allows.

We have planted 21 new trees this spring. I have 3 more to plant from an earlier order. The recent rains have been beneficial. The drought was very real, our overall rain amounts are likely behind normal. As always, the weeds do just fine during dry periods and then flourish when rain arrives. We will get after the weeds with treatment and mulching.

A friendly reminder that there are weight and size limits for residential rubbish and building materials. Chapter 186 Solid Waste. All materials and containers used are to be placed at the streets edge or driveway approach and not in the street. All yard waste (we do not collect grass) is to be separated into like piles and NOT co-mingled. Items for collection should not be placed near or on trees/poles/mailbox or covered by vehicles and or equipment, this will delay or prevent collection. Please discuss with service providers that debris generated by their work is to be hauled away by the service provider. Discuss with service providers to minimize their presence at the street; park in driveways or on one side of the street.

2021 Revaluation Assessors in the Village beginning June 28th

The Village of Maple Bluff is partnered with Associated Appraisal Consultants as our municipal assessment firm. To remain in compliance with Wisconsin State Statutes and commensurate with current housing market values, Associated Appraisal has recommended a village wide revaluation. The purpose of the revaluation is to establish new assessed values, based on current market conditions, for all properties as of January 1, 2021.

Associated Appraisal staff will visit all properties in the Village of Maple Bluff. In order to make accurate assessments, appraisers will conduct an <u>exterior only</u> review of all homes, apartments and businesses. When the assessor arrives at your property, they will knock on your door, step back at least six feet from the door, and will communicate with you at that distance. If you are not home or not comfortable answering questions at the door, the assessor will leave a tag with instructions on how to contact their office. After a tag is left, the assessor will carry on to measure the exterior of the buildings, take exterior photos, and be on their way. After the village wide review process is complete and current assessed values are determined, a Notice of Assessment will be mailed to all property owners in the village. Property owners will then have an opportunity to discuss their assessed values with an assessor during the Open Book session (date will be listed in the letter). If a property owner still objects to their assessment after discussion with the assessor, the property owner may appeal the assessment to the Board of Review (date will be listed in the letter).

Associated Appraisal staff will carry a letter of introduction from the Village of Maple Bluff, a photo ID and will drive red vehicles displaying the Associated Appraisal company name.
