But summer isn't over! Village residents can still realize the benefits of outdoor activities. Every morning I see dozens of our neighbors walking or jogging through our streets and sidewalks. Our Beach Park tennis and pickle ball courts are getting a good workout and cyclists are a common sight; especially on the weekends. We have our Master Gardeners and DPW staff gardening our public flower beds, and folks practicing yoga in our parks. This means more non-vehicular traffic. PLEASE slow down and be careful when driving through our community; especially in the 15 MPH speed zone at Beach Park.

Preventing injuries is one way to maintain the health of our residents, another is continuing our vigilance with respect to COVID 19. On July 27, Public Health Madison and Dane County provided recommendations for mask wearing in indoor public spaces. These recommendations are based on recommendations from the Center for Disease Control and Prevention as the Delta variant has become the predominant strain of the virus. After a lull in COVID 19 infections, we have recently seen an exponential increase in positive cases in Wisconsin and Dane County. This is quite disappointing, especially in our community with our high vaccination and low infection rates!

As a result, we will be implementing a "mask required" policy for Village facilities. This includes the Village Center, the Beach House, and Dailey Cabin. Hopefully we can get this back under control and return to where we were at in June. Until then, wear a mask, maintain distancing, wash your hands, and stay at home if you are symptomatic. We are a community that takes care of each other. These activities promote the wellbeing of us all.

As you are likely aware, in late July the CDC released updated guidance in response to an increase in Delta variant COVID cases. Similarly, local public health officials strongly advised that everyone ages 2 and older, regardless of vaccination status, wear a mask in indoor public spaces and at indoor private gatherings. Health officials stressed that although the advisory was not a public health order, immediate response to rising cases was important for all. As such, we found ourselves responding to change, once again.

Village staff continue to do their best to respond appropriately to the changing health recommendations. As such, masks are again required when in public spaces of the Village Center and we will assess the need to close the office as necessary. We have also reverted to virtual public meetings through Zoom. Reasonable accommodations are made on a case-by-case basis, and we ask everyone to be courteous and considerate of staff and other members of the public. To balance work demands and safety, staff continue to mitigate contagion through measures such as wearing masks when in indoor public areas or when otherwise appropriate, adhering to well-established social distancing practices, and continuing increased hygiene measures we have grown accustomed to. As a local government entity, we take our responsibility to do the right thing seriously – we prioritize protecting our employees, residents, and other community members. We sincerely appreciate your understanding and support.

I also have two personnel announcements to make. First, Officer Javier Salazar accepted an offer for employment with the Middleton Police Department and his last day with our department was July 24th. I congratulate Javier on, what is sure to be, the first stage in a successful career with Middleton. Although I am sad to see him go, I also understand that Middleton presents Javier with unique opportunities for growth and wish him the best of luck! You will be missed Javier. Second, with Javier leaving we have a rare opportunity to hire another full-time Officer. I am very happy to announce the newest addition to our full-time staff - Officer Jeff Aurit. Jeff first started working as a part-time Officer with our department in 2018 and was among the finalists in our most recent hiring process for a full-time position. Jeff accepted the offer to join our team as a full-time Officer and immediately assumed Javier's vacant shift rotation. Please join me in congratulating and welcoming Jeff!

Thank you all, once again, for your support as we continue to respond to changes, challenges, and opportunities! Staff and I know we are fortunate to serve such a great community.

Summer. By: Tom Schroeder

Here we are in the middle of summer, plenty warm... lots of humidity...rain is here and there...mostly there...the ground is hard and dryer than you would like it to be. Grass can bounce back from minor drought conditions. Young trees that are trying to establish their root systems are very susceptible to dry conditions. Flower gardens and vegetable gardens do not fare well to dry conditions either. In times like this please give your trees, young and old alike a little love with some watering. Even better, place 2-3 inches of mulch around the trees/shrubs/gardens to retain moisture. Grass has a defense mechanism that works well whereas trees/shrubs/gardens not so much. They depend on you to help when necessary. Please do!

It has been a challenging month with the heat and dry conditions as we perform our weekly collections, do battle with weeds, remove ash trees, grind the stumps, and restore the terraces the stumps occupied. All the while, our part-time staff had little availability due to the demands of their primary vocation. We are moving toward normalcy, but we are not quite there yet. Masks might be coming back soon; we will deal with it.

I know we all get a tinge of instant gratification from time to time. This might be a chance to indulge yourself...gardening! There are several modestly sized Village gardens that do not have caretakers...at least not to the level and frequency that good gardening requires. I will tell you that there is something soothing and beneficial to working the soil and cultivating beauty with your own hands. To be sustainable and worthwhile, one needs to budget time weekly to get the most out of it. Gratification and beautiful results can be yours! We are looking for volunteers! Buddies and groups are encouraged... it is great exercise...and when done well, the results are amazing.

A few words and guidelines for our departments weekly collection services.

• Yard waste is required to be separated in like piles. Brush/sticks; garden debris; leaves. Small amounts of rocks or dirt should be placed in a container. Keep these items on the terrace or driveway approach...not in the street. We have a lake to think of. We do not collect grass!



- Recycle containers can be filled with appropriate materials. They should not be stuffed so tight that the contents fail to exit the cart. The lid of the cart should close. If there is an issue with your cart let us know and we will work on a solution.
- Trash containers by code are not to be larger than 30 gallon and have a limit of 50 lbs. (container & contents) There are several residents that utilize trash carts equal to the large recycle carts...96 gallon... their weight is 35lbs empty. Can you imagine these carts stuffed with residential waste? We are looking for voluntary compliance. There is another container being used that is smaller but made of very dense plastic and is nearly as heavy as the largest carts on the market.
- I will once again request that trash be placed in plastic bags to minimize exposure to the waste stream. And please use lids to minimize the chance of rain filling the container.
- Bigger is not always better...I remember the days when the norm was Rubbermaid trash cans...30 gallon and indestructible...and manageable.

Have a great second half of the summer and give us a call with your questions and concerns.




