Unfortunately, during this time, there are many in our community who are in need. Food and housing insecurity are growing problems, magnified by the pandemic. Many are experiencing mental health challenges, some of which are exacerbated by social isolation. For many, the holiday season is not a cause for celebration, but another stressor in an already stressful life.

Though these are significant challenges, they are not insurmountable. There is much we as individuals and as a community can do to make a real impact. You can consider contributing to community food, clothing, and toy drives. The "Toys for Tots" drive is in full swing – with a donation site at the Village Center. New, unwrapped toys can be dropped off during business hours. Our local food banks and pantries are accepting food or cash donations. The same is true for the agencies providing services to those who are without housing.

In addition to these measures, I am asking that you take time to check in on your neighbors; especially seniors. Given the nature of our community, we tend to take for granted that someone is looking out for them, when that may not be the case. Social isolation is a significant and growing mental health problem in our senior population. A visit and plate of cookies, a dinner invitation, or sharing a holiday movie can make all the difference. As a bonus, you and your family are the recipients of the benefit of learning from neighbors with tremendous stories to tell.

Finally, I ask that we extend the hand of kindness in what has been a stressful time. The holiday season is meant to celebrate the good in all of us – regardless of religious or community tradition. My hope is that we can carry that throughout the new year. Peace, love, and happiness to you all.

As a friendly reminder, please don't forget to be mindful of security around your home and throughout the neighborhood. Please report suspicious activity and safety concerns to Dane County Dispatch at (608) 255-2345 and continue to dial 911 for emergent situations. We also encourage you to notify us if you travel out of town or have overnight visitors by filling out a vacation request and submitting overnight parking requests. Our request forms can be found on the Police Department page of our Village website (https://villageofmaplebluff.com/home/departments/police-department/). Effective and timely communication can make a significant difference in our ability to respond quickly and deliver public services. I sincerely appreciate everyone's assistance in keeping our village safe.

With safety in mind, I also want to take this opportunity to revisit pedestrian safety. Our Police Officers are

keenly aware of traffic safety importance, especially when roads get slippery and dark comes early. To help improve safety of our community, please consider wearing reflective clothing or carrying a light while walking/biking through the village at night. Drivers can find it hard to see and as a pedestrian focused community, we want everyone to stay safe during the holidays – "out at night, wear a light".

Although we have had a relatively mild introduction to winter thus far, you can rest assured that our Public Works crew is prepared to address the snowfall that will inevitably come. #### PROPERTY TAX BILL INFORMATION

December 21st, 2021 is the statutory deadline for property tax bills to be mailed. If you have not received your property tax bill by December 23rd, please call the village center at 608-244-3048.

Payments can be mailed to 18 Oxford Place, Madison, WI 53704 or dropped off at the Village Center by utilizing the payment box in the front entry. If you would like a receipt, please include an email address or self-addressed envelope. If you need to make an in-person payment, please call 608-244-3048 during our modified office hours of 9:00am-3:00pm Monday-Friday, to schedule an appointment. The office will be closed on December 24th & 31st.

First installment payments are due by January 31, 2022 to the Village of Maple Bluff to avoid interest and penalties. Second installments are due to Dane County by July 31, 2022. If you want to include your property tax payment on your 2021 income taxes, that payment needs to be made on or before December 31, 2021. Please include the bottom portion of your tax bill when making payment.

#### **EMPLOYEE GIFT GIVING POLICY**

The Village of Maple Bluff has an established policy regarding the acceptance of gifts by village employees. Over the years, village residents have been generous during the holidays in expressing their thanks for the hard work of our employees throughout the year. In light of potential liabilities stemming from the acceptance of certain types of gifts, restrictions are placed on what gifts employees may accept. The policy directly prohibits any village employee from individually accepting alcoholic beverages and/or receiving monetary gifts from village residents.

After the holiday season, a party is held for all village employees in appreciation of their hard work. Residents who wish to contribute to the village employee holiday party are asked to direct their gifts to the Clerk/Treasurer to ensure that the gifts can be shared equally by all employees. All gift money collected will be used to pay for the holiday party. A sincere Thank You to those who have contributed to date. We are working on information sharing regarding trash container size/volume/weight. The recycle collector will be changing the 1<sup>st</sup> of the year. Please place your trash and recycle carts in the apron of your drive approach or clear an area near the street for placement.

Holiday Parade of Lights: On Sunday, November 28, 2021, the Maple Bluff Fire Rescue Department held the second annual Holiday Parade of Lights. We hope everyone enjoyed seeing Santa Claus riding in the fire engine and we wish everyone a Happy Holiday Season.





Heating Safety: There is something special about the winter months and curling up with a good book by the fireplace. However, did you know that heating equipment is one of the leading causes of home fires and home fire related deaths? With a few simple safety tips and precautions, you can prevent most heating fires from happening.

- Keep anything that can burn at least three feet away from heating equipment, like the furnace, fireplace, wood stove, or portable space heater.
- Have a three-foot "kid-free zone" around open fires and space heaters.
- Never use your oven to heat your home.
- Have a qualified professional install stationary space heating equipment, water heaters or central heating equipment according to the local codes and manufacturer's instructions.
- Have heating equipment and chimneys cleaned and inspected every year by a qualified professional.
- Remember to turn portable heaters off when leaving the room or going to bed.
- Always use the right kind of fuel, specified by the manufacturer, for fuel burning space heaters.
- Make sure the fireplace has a sturdy screen to stop sparks from flying into the room. Ashes should be cool before putting them in a metal container. Keep the container a safe distance away from your home.
- Test smoke alarms at least once a month.

Waste Management will be performing their final recycling collection on December 29th. Our new contractor, Pellitteri Waste Systems, will take over on January 12th. Initially, Pellitteri will utilize existing recycling carts but you should anticipate the delivery of new receptacles sometime in the spring/summer of 2022. #### DOG AND CAT LICENSING

The Village of Maple Bluff requires licensing of all dogs and cats kept within the village. Licenses will be available for purchase beginning December 21st and are valid for the 2022 calendar year. The cost for dogs is \$20.00 whether spayed/neutered or not. The costs for cats is \$12.50. You will also need to provide a copy of your pet's current rabies vaccination, with expiration date, when obtaining a license. Licenses can be obtained at the Village Center, 18 Oxford Place.

Some highlights include our Arbor Day Festivities, Village Senior Graduation, and Father's Day Parade! While our Fest on the 4th looked different than in years past, we enjoyed new festivities as well as old traditions. We had great participation in CYGW and A&A with more than 80 children enrolled! We also brought the Bocce Bash back this past fall, and raised \$52,000 for our Parks & Recreation Department -- a very special thank you goes out to Trish Grant and Sarah Shah, who put together the entire auction and made our event a success. Be sure to check the ice before venturing out to make sure it's thick enough to support skaters. Generally, ice should be at least 4 inches thick for skating.

Another fun winter activity we're bringing back in 2022 is Winterfest! Winterfest will be held the weekend of January 21-22. We'll have the ever popular Euchre Tournament on Friday, January 21, with details and registration forthcoming! On Saturday, January 22, we'll have a family friendly outdoor Winter party and Chili Cookoff at the Beach House -- details to come!
