Another year has come and gone with, what seems like, the blink of an eye! Much like the previous year, 2021 was filled with unique challenges and opportunities. More will surely come, but for now I want to thank you for your continued support. I hope that each of you had a joyful holiday season and a happy new year, despite any disruptions that COVID may have caused.

As the Omicron variant continues to surge, please know that staff remain vigilant in our masking, exposure, and symptom monitoring protocols. Public Health Madison Dane County once again extended the face covering order, which is now in effect until 1 February 2022. Village Center main doors remain unlocked from 9am to 3pm, Monday through Friday, to allow public access to the common areas of the building. For everyone's health, we still require visitors to wear a mask regardless of vaccination status. The Village Center Gym remains open by reservation only, and all public meetings will continue to be held via Zoom until in-person meetings are advisable.

Despite our need to continue virtual public meetings, I strongly encourage everyone to participate in our Village Caucus at 7pm on January 11th, 2022. The Caucus will take place via Zoom – official notices will be posted as usual and meeting information can be found on our website at <u>www.villageofmaplebluff.com</u>.

For general awareness, we undergo a transition in recycling pickup services in January. Please rest assured that the dates for pick-up are not changing. Our previous contractor, Waste Management, will conduct their final pickup on December 29th, 2021, and our new contractor, Pellitteri Waste Systems, will begin collection on January 12th, 2022. Pellitteri has created a webpage (www.pellitteri.com/pages/village-of-maple<u>bluff</u>) dedicated to support Village resident needs. The page provides helpful information to include pick-up dates and materials that are acceptable for collection.

Finally, as we begin a new year it is only appropriate to introduce a new member of our team. On December 17th, I was proud to accompany our Village President and all full-time Police staff to Madison College's 145th Law Enforcement Academy graduation, welcoming Officer Matthew Dammen to our family. Final Month! By: Tom Schroeder, Director Public Works

Its easy to get caught up with the Holiday Season as well as the end of another calendar year. Often it can be a mixed bag of goods in the best of times...it has been something other than the best of times. The pandemic has warped our sense of normal and challenged us all to adapt and carry on. If we do our best, we will do well.

Just finished our first plowing of the season. Heavy wet snow. Fortunately, we did not get as much rain on top of the snow as was earlier forecasted. The warm and dry December provided us with no frost to protect the sod from the plow edge along with no snowbanks. Unfortunately, it is very easy to stray during the plowing process to come in contact with sod on the terrace. We will address our errant plowing as best we can, and as quickly as possible.

It has been mentioned every year that I have been drafting a newsletter that snow should stay on property, not the neighbor's terrace or onto the street. When this happens, the next driveway gets your snow. Little snowplows can struggle with heavy wet snow, even big plows have challenges with heavy snow. I still say the best snow removal method is with a good strong snow blower that can maximize snow storage the whole season.

I have a special request of all residents: look at your trash container to determine the size. There is a limit of 50 gallon for the size. There are several residents that have 65 and even 95-gallon carts...they are the same sizes that our recycle containers are. The weight limit of trash per container is 50 lbs... that includes the container weight as well. Again, I am looking for voluntary compliance with village code. We have weighed



the 65-gallon carts to be 28-30 lbs empty...the 95-gallon cart is 38-40 lbs empty. Please.

The 10 dog waste stations are for your convenience when walking your dog. We service each of the stations Monday/Wednesday/Friday every week. On occasion we discover the containers are stuffed with dog waste that is in paper bags/trash bags or on special occasions NO bags. The liners that are used to service the containers are not hefty trash can liners. When they are stuffed with yard cleanup pet waste they usually fail. Please only use the stations for dog walks. Thank You!!

Another year providing service to this great community! I truly feel that I am blessed to have the opportunity to continue my career right here in Maple Bluff.
