

Newsletter from the Department of Public Works - July 2023

Elements of the 2023 CIP have started and are continuing. Investigative video of the sanitary lines has started and will continue until finished. This will help determine the condition of the lines and provide insight on how to approach the work with their equipment. This is only the first visit, there will be the lining process that will be more involved and the renewal or adjustments of manhole castings.



We have a couple more trees to plant, if you think your terrace needs a tree give me a call. As for the newly planted trees they need watering with this drought. We will be out with our water vessels to give young terrace and park trees a badly needed drink. Please consider your own trees, young and old, regarding watering. In my book grass will come back, but a neglected tree is likely to stress to a point that they may not recover. Shrubs also!!

We will be spending time and street maintenance funds on Farwell Dr. from Lakewood to Summit to address some of the deterioration along the flow lines and paving joints. This will require grinding the asphalt down 1.5"- 2" to allow us to place hot mix asphalt for the repair. It will be our hands on project for the summer. Once this is done it will be a candidate for chipseal later this year. The parks and gardens are suffering from this drought as well. We are trying to get water to the gardens in a timely manner as to keep them green. Another issue is dealing with the weeds! The weeds must be actively growing for treatment to be affective. We tried to take care of as much as we could after the last rain. We need more rain and soon.

As always when bringing out yard waste keep it on the terrace and not in the street. Also place it so we can approach the materials as well. Keep away from poles/ trees/mailboxes/cars/equipment...all can prevent or delay collections. Please place material in like groupings, do not co-mingle unlike yard waste.

We are still in a hiring mode. We have a promising prospect that we will be interviewing soon!!!

Enjoy the summer! Please have some understanding of the challenges of utility projects, feel free to reach out to me with your questions and concerns. Get your grill out too!!



Fire Rescue Department By Kristopher Loy, Fire Chief




Response Information:

The Maple Bluff Fire Rescue Department (MBFD) has responded to a total of 73 calls for service in 2023.

The MBFD's new ambulance has responded to 22 emergency medical calls which resulted in

11 patients being transported to area hospitals since going into service March 1st, 2023. Our crews have an average response time within the Village of 3 minutes and 58 seconds (from the time we are notified to our arrival on scene).

They have spent the past month completing their orientation and learning the day-to-day operations of our department. 




Concerts in the Park:

With summer in full swing, please be on the lookout for pedestrians and bicyclists throughout the Village, particularly the Beach Corridor. Frequently, youth ride their bikes down the hill from the Club towards the Beach into oncoming traffic. Bicyclists should follow the flow of traffic. The Lakewood entrance to the Club is one-way incoming vehicle traffic with the exit on Kensington Drive. Bicyclists should also exit from the Country Club on Kensington Drive to avoid the blind driveway exit.

Beach House, Dailey Cabin, and Gym Rentals

There is a growing trend with rentals at our facilities, the desire to have amplified noise/music. During June, we have had two incidents that involved resident renters exceeding the time frame amplified noise is allowed in the park and public facilities. As a reminder, Village Ordinance 192.7.1 prohibits the use of amplified noise between the hours of 9:00pm - 7:00am in public parks. This information is also included on the rental form. Be courteous to your fellow neighbors and abide by this ordinance when renting our facilities.

Beach House Staffed Hours

The Beach House will not be staffed July 2, 4, 8, 9, and 30th due to the lack of lifequard staff. The Beach House will also close at 4:45pm on July 3rd and 5th. In these situations, swimmers will swim at their own risk. Know the signs of blue-green algae and if present keep yourself and your pets out of the water. Bluegreen algae blooms occur throughout the summer in Lake Mendota. The water can appear green or blue and has a distinct smell. When in doubt, please exercise caution, stay out and keep your pets from entering the water. Public Health Madison-Dane County is scheduled to test the water quality weekly for E.Coli, but blue-green algae can appear within a few hours. The swim raft was assembled in early June and moved down to Beach Park. The raft presents several challenges to our lifeguard team regarding response times, boat traffic between the swim raft and the roped swim area, and the murky, deeper water near the raft makes visibility difficult. Please remind your kids of the dangers that are present with the swim raft and encourage them when lifeguard staff is absent to use a buddy system.

Beach House Tennis Courts

Be courteous to your fellow neighbors and adhere to the time of play recommendation of 1-hour if people are waiting. The Village Tennis Courts have been reserved every Thursday from 6:00pm - 8:00pm, Saturday morning from 8:00am - 10:00am, and Friday afternoons from 1:00pm - 3:00pm.

No tennis or pickleball can be played on the courts before 7am and after 9pm. If people are waiting to play, try to limit your use to an hour to allow others to enjoy the courts. Please check the Village's calendar before playing to make sure they are available for open play and not reserved for exclusive use.

Bocce Recap

Another successful Bocce has come and gone. This was the first time in my 14+ years with the Village that I have missed the event. Village staff put forth a considerable amount of time and energy into the preparation and delivery of the event to ensure a successful kick-off to the summer. This year's event crowned 2 first time champions in the Tournament Jeff Olsen and John White, congratulations! In total the event grossed \$62,000, which the Parks and Recreation Committee will be adding to the previous Bocce Reserve account for Johnson Park improvements.
