2022 Dailey Service Award Winners

The Dailey Service Award is a prestigious award named after the first recipients, Warren and Ann Dailey (2004), which recognizes individuals whose village volunteerism and leadership are both extraordinary and inspiring. Much like many of their predecessors, this year's winners stand out for their countless hours of volunteering and dedication to the Village. Most of you likely have known them from the email reminders regarding the Bocce Beach Bash Silent Auction. It is with great honor to recognize Trish Grant and Sarah Shah as the recipients of the 2022 Dailey Service Award.

Sarah Shah began her involvement in 2016 while assisting then-Chairs Cynthia Johnson and Sheila Young with entering donation items. Trish Grant joined the Silent Auction team in 2018 to jointly take over the helm from Sheila Young and Cynthia Johnson. Trish and Sarah have continuously met and exceeded the high bar of the silent auction benefiting Maple Bluff's Parks and Recreational Programs set by the previous organizers. Collectively, Trish and Sarah have raised over \$150,000 in donations from the silent auction with the two highest grossing events occurring in 2019 and 2021, respectively. This money has been used to help fund new playground equipment at Beach, McBride, and Firemen's Park, adjustable basketball hoop at Firemen's Park, bike repair station at Beach Park, and key fob access to facilities, just to name a few. Their months of planning, organizing, and outreach are on top of full-time careers and raising growing boys. The continued success of the auction would be impossible without the donations from all our generous neighbors. The vacation homes, parties, unique experiences, and friendly competitions are not only what make this fundraiser successful, but what makes Maple Bluff a very special place to live.

I would also like to recognize three of our part-time Police Officers who have been hired full-time at other agencies. Congratulations to Chris Jauch, JP Contreras, and Matt Dammen! Each of these officers served our community over the past several years, however with their new commitments will be unable to continue their part-time employment with us. provide feedback about undergrounding electrical lines throughout our community. We had an outstanding turnout and I want to thank all who participated! We will conduct one final round of targeted information gathering and then share all data with MG&E. We are hopeful that with this information, our partnership with MG&E will lead to reduced susceptibility to storm outages.

In addition to infrastructure improvements, we are continually striving to enhance our communication with you, our residents. 

2023 Property Assessment Open Book and Board of Review Sessions

2023 Open Book sessions will be held by phone with the assessor on Monday, June 26th from 1:00pm - 3:00pm. Please call 920-749-1995 to set up a telephone appointment.

If the assessor is not available when you call to make an appointment, please leave a message and they will make every effort to return your call within 24 hours. Please provide your name, phone number, the Municipality in which the property is located, and the Parcel Number from your assessment notice or tax bill.

If you wish to enter a formal appeal to the Board of Review, you must give notice of your intent by contacting the municipal clerk at least 48-hours before the Board of Review begins on July 11, 2023 at 7:00pm. Failure to provide 48-hour advance notice to the clerk may result in denial of a hearing at the Board of Review. 


Response Information:

The Maple Bluff Fire Rescue Department (MBFD) has responded to a total of 59 calls for service in 2023.


The MBFD's new ambulance has responded to 15 emergency

medical calls which resulted in nine patients being transported to area hospitals since going into service March 1st, 2023. Our crews have an average response time within the Village of 3 minutes and 50 seconds (from the time we're notified to our arrival on scene).



EMS Week:

In 1974, President Gerald Ford authorized Emergency Medical Services Week to celebrate EMS practitioners and the important work they do in our nation's communities. From May 21-27, 2023, the MBFD honored our personnel who dedicate countless hours of training and on-call time to help provide day-to-day lifesaving services to our residents. Newsletter from the Department of Public Works - June 2023

Spring in the Village is a busy time of year! The transition from winter conditions to an exasperating springtime warm up...and cool down...repeat the episode over and over again. It appears that spring is here to stay and will give us some flashes of summer to boot. The season's cleanup is under way as we attend to the snowplow scrapes and restoration from the contractor that worked the undergrounding for AT&T last year. Residential clean up is and has been underway, even some of the aftermath of last year's June storm is still making it to the roadside for collection. I'll touch on some of the highlights.

An Arbor Day & Bird City Celebration took place on April 29th. It was split with the Bird City and Martin House raising taking place at Beach Park with Paul and Barb Noeldner providing an outstanding array of Nature Educational Displays and fun activities for kids and adults alike. Eagle Scout, Henry Gill and fellow scouts provided a Martin House raising as the final act of a very successful Eagle Scout project. The fundraising that took place for this project was so successful the Marina Martin House may see a rebirth this year as well. A great job from the young men of Troop 5 Scouts.



The Arbor Day Celebration took place at the Veterans Memorial with a beautiful Red Maple placed adjacent to a matching Red Maple installed the day before. It was a group effort with the following attendees providing the effort for the tree installation: Julie Cornelius, CeCe Easton, Tim Jackman, Cyndi Sugar, Dave Sugar, Clarke Sugar, and Soren Sugar. I applaud everyone's grit, for the day was cold damp and windy. It was both a pleasure and an honor to spend time with this group of extraordinary people.

We have installed half of the 22 ordered trees for this year's tree replacement program. It will be a challenge to get the balance of our order into their new locations to sustain the diverse urban forest in Maple Bluff. Hint, they are not all maples!!! If you are looking/hoping for a tree, feel free to reach out and contact me so we can



make that happen, I am always looking for good homes for new trees.

The Marina pier is in, and the Beach pier should be in soon.

The grinding of stumps has started. A few of the trees removed were very large, I predict it will take some time to accomplish this mission.

Farwell Drive from Lakewood to Summit will be the focus of our street maintenance this year. The intent is to have pea gravel surfacing this fall. There will be hot mix asphalt repair where the surface has degraded the most. We will address the hot mix work in June or July.

DPW Foreman, Paul Elliott has been addressing several annual DNR submittals that are due this time of year. Paul has been taking on this responsibility for several years now. P.S. the delegating will continue.

Our department is once again in a hiring process to find a new team member for Public Works.

We have a scheduled meeting with the contractors who will be taking on the storm and sewer projects this year. I anticipate that we will come away with a good idea of when the work will take place.

Rentals

2023 Key Fob Program

Were you a member of the 2022 key fob program and did not renew for 2023? If so, please return your key fob to the Village Center so that it can be assigned to other residents. If you are currently a 2023 member, do you know where your key fob(s) are located? If you have misplaced your fob, please notify the Village Center as soon as it has been misplaced for it to be deactivated. These fobs provide access to the Village Center, Beach House, and Dailey Cabin and could provide a safety and security risk if lost.

Beach House Staff Hours

The Beach House will officially be staffed the first full week of June. Great news, the Village will be installing the swim raft this summer, pending the availability of our contractor. There may be occasions where lifeguard staff are not present due to scheduling conflicts. In these situations, SWIM AT YOUR OWN RISK.

Know the signs of blue-green algae and if present keep yourself and your pets out of the water. Blue-green algae blooms occur throughout the summer in Lake Mendota. The water can appear green or blue and has a distinct smell. When in doubt, please exercise caution, stay out and keep your pets from entering the water. Public Health Madison-Dane County is scheduled to test the water quality weekly for E.Coli, but bluegreen algae can appear within a few hours. For more information and test results visit:
