
Fire Rescue Department By Kristopher Loy, Fire Chief



Response Information:

The Maple Bluff Fire Rescue Department (MBFD) has responded to a total of 151 calls for service in 2023. The MBFD's new ambulance has responded to 53 emergency medical calls resulting in 29 patients being transported to

area hospitals. Our crews have an average response time within the Village of 3 minutes 53 seconds (dispatch to arrival on scene).

On Sunday, November 12, 2023, a portion of the Madison Marathon passed through the Village of Maple Bluff. Our police and fire departments were on standby throughout the event to help provide a safe environment for the nearly 2,000 participants. Great job everyone!


Winter Boot of the second seco

Winter holidays are a time for families and friends to get together. But that also means a greater risk of fire. Following a few simple tips will ensure a happy and fire-safe holiday season.

🔩 Holiday decorating

- Be careful with holiday decorations. Choose decorations that are flame resistant or flame retardant.
- Keep lit candles away from decorations and other things that can burn.
- Some lights are only for indoor or outdoor use, but not both.
- broken cords or loose bulb connections. Read manufacturer's instructions for number of light strands to connect.
- Use clips, not nails, to hang lights so the cords do not get damaged.
- · Keep decorations away from windows and doors.

Holiday entertaining



- Keep children and pets away from lit candles.
- Keep matches and lighters up high in a locked cabinet.
- Stay in the kitchen when cooking on the stovetop.
- Ask smokers to smoke outside. Remind smokers to keep their smoking materials with them so young children do not touch them.
- Provide large, deep ashtrays for smokers. Wet cigarette butts with water before discarding.



Before Heading Out or to Bed

Blow out lit candles when you leave the room or go to bed. **Turn off** all light strings and decorations before leaving home or going to bed.

FACTS

- More than one-third of home decoration fires are started by candles.
- More than two of every five decoration fires happen because decorations are placed too close to a heat source.

DOG AND CAT LICENSING

The Village of Maple Bluff requires licensing of all dogs and cats kept within the village per Ordinance §82-3. Licenses will be valid for the 2024 calendar year. Licenses can be purchased online under the Parks and Recreation page, or you may complete the form that will be included in your property tax bill packet. The license cost for dogs is \$30.00. The cost for cats is \$20.00. You will also need to provide a copy of your pet's current rabies vaccination, with expiration date. A license will not be issued if proof of rabies vaccination has not been provided to the village.

PROPERTY TAX BILL INFORMATION

December 18th, 2023 is the statutory deadline for property tax bills to be mailed. If you have not received your property tax bill by December 23rd, please call the Village Center at 608-244-3048. Payments can be mailed to 18 Oxford Place, Madison, WI 53704 or dropped off at the Village Center by utilizing the payment box in the front entry. If you would like a receipt, please include an email address or self-addressed envelope. Office hours are Monday - Thursday 8:00 am - 4:00 pm and Fridays 8:00am - 12:00pm. First installment payments are due no later than January 31, 2024 to the Village of Maple Bluff to avoid interest and penalties. Second installments are due to Dane County by July 31, 2024. If you want to include your property tax payment on your 2023 income taxes, payment needs to be made on or before December 31, 2023. Please include the bottom portion of your tax bill when making payment.

EMPLOYEE GIFT GIVING POLICY

The Village of Maple Bluff has an established policy regarding the acceptance of gifts by village employees. Over the years, village residents have been generous during the holidays in expressing their thanks for the hard work of our employees throughout the year. Considering potential liabilities stemming from the acceptance of certain types of gifts, restrictions are placed on what gifts employees may accept. The policy directly prohibits any village employee from individually accepting alcoholic beverages and/or receiving monetary gifts from village residents. After the holiday season, a party is held for all village employees in appreciation of their hard work. Residents who wish to contribute to the village employee holiday party are asked to direct their gifts to the Clerk/Treasurer to ensure that the gifts can be shared equally by all employees. A sincere Thank You to those who have contributed to date. Employees of the Village of Maple Bluff take pride in their work and thank residents for their cooperation and support throughout the year.

Veterans Memorial



It is hard to believe that more than four years have passed since the Maple Bluff Veterans Memorial was dedicated on July 4th, 2019. A committee of dedicated residents designed the monument, selected the site in Johnson Park and raised the funds for its' construction. Upon completion of the construction and dedication the memorial was officially turned over to the village. However, the committee members, Rick Apfel, Julie Cornelius, Curt Erickson, John Schmid, Sandra Thomas, and Ellis Waller have continued to decorate the memorial for Memorial Day, July 4th, Veterans Day, and Christmas each year since it was dedicated.

In November the committee transferred the honor of decorating the memorial to Maple Bluff's - Troop 5. The troop will continue the tradition of decorating the memorial on the four holidays. Scoutmaster, Wesley Gill commented, "this new responsibility for the troop will be an excellent addition to the troop's patriotic and citizenship programs."

The memorial is dedicated to those members of the Army, Navy, Marines, Air Force, Coast Guard, and Merchant Marines who have lived in the Village of Maple Bluff before, during, or after their active duty or reserve service. Those who have served in the past or are currently serving are eligible to be listed on the memorial. If you have served in the armed forces or know of a village resident who has they can be included on the memorial. Contact Curt Erickson at the Village Hall for further information.

Gym Use

- 1. Access to Open Gym is granted through the Village's key fob program.
- 2. Key fob members may bring up to 3 non-key fob members per use.
- 3. Members that wish to bring more than 3 guests must reserve the gym online at a minimum of 24 hours in advance. No day of reservations are permitted.
- 4. No food or beverages are allowed inside the gym, excluding water in an enclosed container.
- 5. Put all equipment away and notify Village staff of any problems or broken equipment.

Hours: Open Gym will vary depending on the day of the week, programming, and rentals. The gym will close daily at **9:00pm**. To check availability, visit the Village's website and select the Parks and Recreation tab, you will find the Parks and Recreation Calendar on this page. If no events are listed, the gym would be available for Open Play.
