BIOGRAPHY: Kyle Knoeck



Detective Sergeant Kyle Knoeck is a 12-year veteran enforcement of law and holds a bachelor's degree in criminal justice from the University of Wisconsin-Oshkosh. After graduating from UW-Oshkosh, he attended Fox Valley Technical College in Appleton where he became certifiable as a law enforcement

officer. Shortly after graduating from the police academy, Detective Sergeant Knoeck was hired as a Police Officer for the town of Madison Police Department and worked there for approximately six years. During these six years, he served the department as a Field Training Officer, Evidence Technician, and High-Risk Apprehension Team Operator. During his tenure with the town of Madison, he gained a multitude of experience investigating a wide variety of serious crimes to include homicides, robberies, sexual assaults, burglaries, crimes against children, and other high priority cases. In 2018, Detective Sergeant Knoeck was hired by the City of Stoughton Police Department where he served as a Field Training Officer, High Risk Apprehension Team Operator, member of the multi-jurisdictional Special Events Team, and a member of the Motor Unit. He received multiple awards while working for the Stoughton Police Department, including the prestigious Officer of the Year Award in 2019.

In 2021, Detective Sergeant Knoeck was presented with and gratefully accepted the opportunity to join the Maple Bluff Police Department (MBPD) in a full-time capacity as Detective Sergeant. Since he had been employed with the MBPD since 2015 in a part-time capacity, he was already familiar with the department operations and was in alignment with the vision, mission, philosophies, and policing strategies of the department. Detective Sergeant Knoeck currently oversees department operations, investigations, in-service training/officer development, and the field training program. In addition to these responsibilities, he also works a patrol shift, responds to calls within the village, and directly supervises the patrol officers. Notably, Detective Sergeant Knoeck received the Village Commendation award in March 2024 for his commendatory performance while serving as the Operations Sergeant for the Village of Maple Bluff Police Department.

certifications and is a member of various organizations, all of which enhance his capabilities to protect and serve the Village of Maple Bluff. Detective Sergeant Knoeck is a member of the Wisconsin Association of Identification, Wisconsin Association of Fraud Investigators, and the Financial Crime Investigators of Greater Madison Group. In addition to these memberships, Detective Sergeant Knoeck is also a certified Cellebrite operator and physical analyst which assists MBPD with investigations involving digital forensics. Detective Sergeant Knoeck is also a graduate of the Wisconsin Department of Justice First Line Supervisor Course. He also serves the MBPD as a state certified instructor in the topics of Emergency Vehicle Operation and Control, Vehicle Contacts, Operating while Intoxicated/ Standardized Field Sobriety Testing, Tactical Response, Scenarios, Officer Wellness, and Constitutional Law.

Detective Sergeant Knoeck resides in the greater Madison area with his wife, three children, and his dog named Dave. In his free time, Detective Sergeant Knoeck enjoys spending time with his family, golfing, riding his motorcycle, and working towards he and his wife's goal of visiting all fifty states.

- Residents can book private events (meetings, holiday events, weddings) at the Club. Please call the club to speak with the Events Manager.


Membership

Has Spring really sprung? Only Mother Nature knows. So, with the change in temperatures comes our different challenges. Please keep yard waste separate from sticks, and as always, please do not place any of those materials into the roadway. We are trying to protect our lakes from debris getting into our Storm infrastructure which leads straight to the lakes. We do not collect grass, so please do not place that out for collection. We would encourage you to use the clippings in flower beds or mulch the grass back into your lawn.

If you have a contractor that does work for you, please inform them of these simple rules. Ask them not to park on both sides of the street opposite one another as that may limit traffic's ability to continue down the street and could prevent a firetruck or other emergency vehicles from getting through. Looking forward to planting flowers in May and seeing what next month will bring.

The Public Works crew has been busy over the past few months installing our required meter replacements for 2023 & 2024 per DNR Standards. In addition, the Village is undertaking a multi-year project to install cloud-based readers on the meters. Please do not schedule replacements until the Village has communicated your home is due for replacement. All 2023 & 2024 replacements have been mailed with many residents promptly scheduling their upgrades. Thank you.
