2025 Assessment Open Book and Board of Review Sessions

2025 Open Book sessions will be held by phone with the assessor on Thursday, May 22nd from 10:00am - noon. Please call 920-749-1995 to arrange a telephone appointment. Additional Open Book appointments can be accommodated but must be scheduled no later than 7 days prior to the Board of Review. Board of Review will be held on June 10th, 2025.

If the assessor is not available when you call to make an appointment, please leave a message and they will make every effort to return your call within 24 hours. Please provide your name, phone number, the Municipality in which the property is located, and the Parcel Number from your assessment notice or tax bill.

If, after speaking with the assessor, you wish to enter a formal appeal to the Board of Review, you must give notice of your intent by contacting the municipal clerk at least 48 hours before the Board of Review begins. Failure to provide 48 hours advance notice to the clerk may result in denial of a hearing at the Board of Review. 
our Veteran's Memorial in Johnson Park—a cherished place of reflection and inspiration. The contributions and legacies of both men are immense, and they will be dearly missed.

Thank you for your continued support and engagement. I look forward to a productive and positive summer season as we continue our work together for the benefit of all residents.



Medical Director Maple Bluff Fire and Rescue

Over the last two years we have significantly improved our emergency response time and transport to the hospital by the addition of our own ambulance. To further improve care for the rare catastrophic medical problems such as cardiac arrest and accidental overdose, community education on initial care in these situations can make a difference. Survival from cardiac arrest is significantly improved by immediate initiation of CPR and early use of an AED. Access to Narcan in an accidental overdose can also be lifesaving. The Maple Bluff Fire and Rescue Department is going to initiate Village training in hands only CPR, AEFD use and Narcan administration. AED devices are available at several sites in the Village. The first training course will be held May 21st, 2025, at 7:00 PM at the Maple Bluff Fire Department ((18 Oxford PL, Madison, WI 53704). Other opportunities will also be made available in the future.

It is humbling when the powers that be bring rain...thunder and lightning...HAIL...strong winds. Some destructive, some not. I thought the weather forecast was for a sunny 70-degree day, not quite. All of us need to be prepared to pivot in a moment's notice for the weather or so many other things that can challenge us when we may least expect it.

Our water meter reading head installation continues. Some of our messaging was redundant and a little wordy. It has been edited. No one will think of us as great secretaries, but we will do our best and a little bit of help from you to make a timely appointment for us to make the installation, all should be good.

Spring clean-up is in high gear! Please remember not to place materials onto the street where it then can be washed into the storm system that deposits into the lake. Just as important is not the co-mingled materials. We still find rocks and sticks and all kinds of stuff hidden in leaf piles. We will find old firewood lurking under yard waste. Also do not place around or over decorative rocks and other landscaping; utility poles; mailbox's; trees; cars and trucks and trailers. It will delay/prevent collection. We have made it a point to get through the village every week for yard waste collection during the growing season and beyond for many years.

We will continue our trimming of young trees, other than oak due to restrictions. We will have a few trees to plant this year. Most of our budget will go to hazardous tree removal this year.

Arbor Day and Migratory Bird Day took place at Beach Park on April 26th. Pictures will follow next month with a report of the activities.

Many of the little gardens in the village will be reduced or eliminated as DPW cannot apply enough time and energy that good gardening needs. We will try to do well in the small number that we will work with. Gardening should be a shared endeavor with friends and family. Years ago... and I mean years ago, the Gardening Club thrived. Now, it seems everyone is too busy to commit to a sole altering activity like gardening in their community with good friends and family. Maybe people could slow down and enjoy getting their hands in the dirt...and enjoy the feel good that comes with it. I'm going to still get MY fix of gardening!

Open Gym

Use of the gym is available through the key fob program or by exclusive rental. Please adhere to the below rules during your use:

- Key fob users may bring up to 3 guests per use. Users with more than 3 guests may rent the gym online up to 24-hours in advance.
- Disposal of dirty diapers is prohibited.
- Respect others and be courteous. If the gym is full, users may play games together or half court games. Limit half court games to one hour.
- Food, drinks, and gum are not allowed in the gym.
- Street shoes are not allowed in the gym. Please bring a change of shoes when using the gym.
- Dunking or hanging on basketball rims is prohibited.
- Users under 12 must be accompanied by an adult.
- No using foul/obscene language.
- No lowering of Basketball hoops without written consent of Recreation Department.
- Put all equipment away and notify Village staff of any problems or broken equipment.
- Failure to abide by the gym rules may result in additional fees and/or revocation of key fob privileges.

Hours: The gym is available 7-days a week from 8am - 9pm. Please check the Village's Parks and Recreation calendar for availability.

The gym offers exclusive Toddler Open Gym Monday - Friday from 8:00am - 11:00am, unless schools are cancelled or scheduled off.

The gym will also offer exclusive Pickleball Hours from 11:00am - 1:00pm Monday - Friday, unless no school. The Village gym has pickleball lines and a portable net.

Users are suggested to bring their own paddles and balls.
