**Structure Fire Response**

On Wednesday, March 17, 2021 at approximately 10:45am the Maple Bluff Fire Rescue Department responded as part of a MABAS Box Alarm Assignment into the Town of Vienna at the request of the Deforest-Windsor Fire/EMS Department for a working structure fire. Upon arrival, fire crews were met with heavy fire conditions and several patients who suffered smoke inhalation. Our crew assisted with fire attack, overhaul, and provided a translator to assist with the fire investigation. Several residents were transported to area hospitals with injuries, and the cause of the fire is still under investigation.

The arrival of spring has provided several teaser days along with a few reality checks reminding all of us that winter conditions can and will occur long past its welcome. For the most part it has been a level handed transition from winter to spring and looks to be the trend going into April.

As the warm-up and green-up continue so will the spring clean-up. Please keep in mind that materials placed at the street for collection need to be separated into like groupings. Leaf piles need to be clean...not mixed with mulch/dirt/rocks/bricks/sticks/branches/wood chunks. When we encounter these conditions, it leads to delays and or suspension of our ability to continue collections due to clogs and or the need to repair our equipment. All materials require separation on the terrace, and not in the street. Vehicles and equipment parked too close will delay or prevent collection of yard waste as well. Thank you.

We have a lengthy list of recommended tree removals this year. Ash trees will be our focus this spring. Overall condition of any of the recommended trees will determine the priority of scheduling.

With subtractions from the urban forest there then needs to be additions. I anticipate at minimum that we will plant 2 dozen trees this spring. There are more open spaces for replacement trees than we can plant this year...it may take the next year or two to close that gap. I will drop off a note regarding intent to remove a tree from the terrace right-of-way at the address of concern. As for new trees, I have heard from several interested residents...and I expect to hear from many more.

Along with our weekly assignments, we will be cleaning storm water catch basins as well as related pipes. These basins catch materials that flow down the street during moderate to heavy rain falls that enter the storm water system. What is not caught in the basin has a chance to flow to the lake. Another reminder to keep your yard waste on the terrace for collection.

We will also be installing the marina and beach park pier in the coming weeks.

There are more than a few potholes that will require cold mix now, and a more permanent hot mix fix later this year.

We are intending to replace residential water meters at a rate of 40-50 per year. You will be contacted when needed and your cooperation is appreciated.


