



Notable Calls

Maple Bluff Police Department

June 2026

The information provided below summarizes some of the incidents that officers responded to over the past month. Please note that most narratives reflect initial and preliminary details gathered by personnel in the field at the time of the incident. As investigations progress, the facts, circumstances, and even the classification of the incidents may change.

06/01/25: Traffic Arrest , 5:14 PM – A MBPD officer conducted a traffic stop on a vehicle after observing the driver not wearing a seatbelt and for displaying plates that did not return on the vehicle on N Sherman Ave near Sherman Ave. During the traffic stop, a 28-year-old male driver provided false identifying information to the MBPD officer. The male's true identity was discovered, and he was found to have three open criminal cases with bail conditions prohibiting him from operating a motor vehicle. The male was arrested for 1 count of Resisting and Obstructing Police and 3 counts of Misdemeanor Bail Jumping. The male was lodged at the Dane County Jail.

06/03/2026: Burglary (garage), 12:50 PM – A village resident contacted MBPD reference to a belated burglary of their garage. 2 lawn mower batteries and a charger were reported as stolen. The investigating MBPD officer was able to determine a timeframe, and the stolen property information was entered into law enforcement databases. No suspect(s) have been arrested as of 7/4/2026.

06/07/2026: Retail Theft / Trespassing, 9:33 PM – MBPD officers were dispatched to a retail theft at a business in the 600 block of N Sherman Ave. Upon arrival, it was discovered a 39-year-old male subject had walked past the last point of sale without paying for 2 items. The business did not want the male arrested but did want him trespassing. MBPD officers located the male and trespassed him from the business.

6/10/2026: OWI Arrest, 5:11 PM – A MBPD officer observed a vehicle with an equipment violation and demonstrating possible intoxicated driving behaviors on N Sherman near Lakewood Blvd. A traffic stop was conducted, and the 52-year-old male driver was found to be impaired. The male was arrested for OWI 3rd offense and released to a responsible party.

6/12/2026: Vehicle Versus Pedestrian Crash, 2:31 PM – A MBPD officer was dispatched to a vehicle versus pedestrian accident at Lakewood Blvd and Fisk Pl. Subsequent investigation revealed that the 83-year-old female driver failed to see a pedestrian in the crosswalk. The driver struck the pedestrian, causing non-life-threatening injuries. The driver remained on scene, cooperated with the investigation, and was ultimately cited for Failure to Yield to Pedestrian in Crosswalk. The victim was transported to an area hospital for treatment of their injuries.

6/13/2026: Assist Police, 4:48 AM – A MBPD officer was requested to assist Madison PD with a shooting investigation near State St and W. Gilman. Two victims were shot and a suspect was believed to still be in the immediate area. The MBPD officer assisted while officers established a perimeter and regional drone resources searched for the suspect. The 18-year-old suspect was



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ultimately captured on scene and was arrested for 2 counts of Attempted 1st Degree Intentional Homicide.

6/13/2026: Stolen Vehicle Recovery, 5:04 PM – MBPD officers were alerted by a reliable law enforcement tool that a freshly stolen Jeep from the City of Madison was potentially approaching the Village of Maple Bluff. MBPD officers intercepted the stolen vehicle on E Johnson near 3rd St. A high-risk traffic stop was conducted and 2 male subjects, a 36-year-old male and a 31-year-old male, were detained without incident. A subsequent k9 sniff and search of the vehicle by Madison PD revealed evidence of drug distribution. MBPD Officers assisted in transporting 1 of the males to the Dane County Jail on Madison PD's charges and a Wisconsin Department of Corrections hold. Madison PD maintained as the primary investigating agency as the vehicle was originally stolen in their jurisdiction.

6/23/2026: Traffic Arrest, 2:04 PM – A MBPD officer conducted a traffic stop on a vehicle after observing an equipment violation near N Sherman Ave and Lakewood Blvd. The 49-year-old male driver was discovered to have an ignition interlock device (IID) requirement due to prior OWI convictions. He did not have an IID installed as required and was found to have an open felony case. The driver was arrested for Failure to Install IID when Required and Felony Bail Jumping lodged at the Dane County Jail.

6/25/2026: Stolen Vehicle and Stolen Handgun Recovery, 3:50 PM – MBPD officers were alerted to a stolen vehicle operating in Maple Bluff by a reliable law enforcement tool. MBPD officers were eventually able to locate the vehicle traveling north on Huxley from Commercial Ave. The vehicle pulled into the parking lot of The View Apartments located at 905 Huxley. A high-risk traffic stop was conducted, and 4 female occupants were detained. A Glock 43x semi-automatic handgun with an extended magazine was visible inside the stolen vehicle. The handgun was determined to have been stolen during a 2024 theft in Fargo, North Dakota. The driver of the vehicle, a 17-year-old female, was arrested for Operating a Motor Vehicle without Owner's Consent (OMVWOC). The front passenger, a 17-year-old female, was arrested for OMVWOC – Party to a Crime, Receiving Stolen Property and Carrying a Concealed Weapon. The rear passengers, both 18-year-old females, were arrested for OMVOC – Party to a Crime. All 4 suspects were lodged at the Dane County Jail.

6/25/2026: Traffic Arrest, 1:14 AM – MBPD officers on patrol near N Sherman and Roth St had their attention drawn to a vehicle which appeared to be attempting to evade their presence. The vehicle also displayed a crooked rear plate that was registered to a different vehicle. Based on driving behaviors in tandem with registration irregularities, a traffic stop was conducted on the vehicle in front of The View Apartments at 905 Huxley. A 33-year-old male inside the vehicle provided false identifying information to an MBPD officer. The male's identity was discovered and found to have multiple warrants through Dane County for Retail Theft, Felony Bail Jumping and Possession of Drug Paraphernalia. The male was arrested on his warrants, charged with Resisting and Obstructing Police, and placed on a Wisconsin Department of Corrections hold.



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6/26/2026: Disorderly Conduct, 10:24 PM – An MBPD officer was dispatched to an unwanted subject complaint at a business in the 600 block of N Sherman Ave. Upon arrival, an intoxicated 73-year-old male was contacted and advised the business owner wanted him to leave due to his behavior. The officer arranged transportation for the individual away from the business. Shortly after this, the male returned to the business. MBPD officers again responded and requested the male move along as he was now trespassing. The male refused and was promptly arrested and held at the Dane County Jail for Disorderly Conduct.

6/27/2026: Traffic Arrest, 10:12 AM – A MBPD officer conducted a traffic stop at the intersection of N Sherman and Fordem Ave for an apparent license violation. During the traffic stop, a 37-year-old male passenger provided false identifying information to the MBPD officer. The passenger's identity was discovered, and he was cited on scene for Resisting and Obstructing Police. Open intoxicants were also located inside the vehicle and the driver, a 26-year-old male, was cited for keeping Open Intoxicants in Motor Vehicle – Driver.

6/27/2026: Warrant Arrest, 12:22 AM – A MBPD officer observed a vehicle committing multiple moving and equipment violations near N Sherman and Roxbury. A traffic stop was conducted and the 28-year-old female driver was found to have a warrant for Failure to Appear for a traffic offense through Columbia County, WI. The female was arrested on her warrant and lodged at the Dane County Jail.

6/29/2026: Burglary / Vehicle Theft / Terminated Pursuit, 5:27 AM – A MBPD officer assisted the Cottage Grove Police Department in locating a vehicle stolen during a residential burglary in their jurisdiction. Information indicated that the vehicle and its occupants were likely involved in additional criminal activity. The stolen vehicle was located near Packers Avenue and International Lane, and the MBPD officer attempted a traffic stop. The driver fled, engaging the officer in a vehicle pursuit. The pursuit was later terminated, the vehicle was subsequently located abandoned, and witnesses reported seeing several individuals flee on foot. Additional information led officers to The View Apartments at 905 Huxley, where follow-up investigation continues to seek identification of those responsible.
