Dear Maple Bluff Residents,

We are pleased to announce that we will be launching a new online payment portal through Caselle Community Connect in October 2026. This new service provider will allow for:

ONLINE PAYMENTS

Make secure payments online by bank account, debit card, or credit card.

HISTORICAL DATA

See current and past statements, account activity, and payment history.

PAPERLESS BILLING

Sign up for paperless billing and reduce clutter.

24/7 ACCESS

Access your account when it works best for you.

It will also allow multiple occupants to create accounts to view utility billing and allow for one-time utility payments if you choose not to create an account. We anticipate the transition to take place in early October, encouraging the 3rd quarter water bills to be paid through Caselle Community Connect since PSN will no longer be active shortly after the new payment portal launches.

We hope the change in our online payment services will make utility billing an easier process. We plan to share more information as we get closer to the changeover date and will be sending a reminder of the changes with the 3rd quarter billing. Thank you!

Summer has been filled with discussion about the proposed improvements to Maple Bluff Country Club. I encourage all residents to review the Maple Bluff Country Club lease with the Village of Maple Bluff (<https://villageofmaplebluff.com/wp-content/uploads/2026/06/Maple-Bluff-Country-Club-Lease-2015.pdf>), as well as the Village Attorney's memorandum regarding the Board of Trustees' responsibilities in reviewing the proposal (<https://ecode360.com/MA2098/document/753269447.pdf>). The Board's responsibility is to ensure our review is consistent with the lease and that we have sufficient information to evaluate the proposal, including its financial viability and compliance with the lease's resident membership requirements. These are important decisions with long-term implications for the Village, and I appreciate everyone's patience as the Board works to ensure the process is thorough, transparent, and consistent with our responsibilities.

Trustee Jim Schuler continues to lead our efforts on the Village Gateway Plan. Jim has attended a series of meetings with Village Public Works, the City of Madison, and our engineering team. Please take time to review the recent Public Works discussion and Gateway Plan on our website. Thank you, Jim, for your leadership on this important initiative.

The events that occurred on Madison's near east side are heartbreaking. Chief of Police Tanner Nystrom and I have had several discussions about what the Village of Maple Bluff can do to better protect our residents,

our City of Madison neighbors, and our police officers. Training? Policy? Procedures? Technology? Staffing? What additional steps can we or should we take to reduce risk and improve outcomes?

I know we will continue to support our Village staff and Police Department as they serve our community with excellent training, equipment, and technology. As many of you know, the Village of Maple Bluff has equipped our officers with body-worn cameras for more than a decade because we believe they provide greater transparency, accountability, and valuable evidence for everyone involved. Many communities, including Madison, are now moving toward implementing them as well. As you know, we also had healthy debate about another piece of technology—Flock public safety cameras. While technology alone cannot prevent every tragedy, these tools can help officers respond more effectively and help investigators better understand what occurred. I appreciate Tanner, our Police Department, and the Village Board's continued willingness to thoughtfully evaluate technology and systems that enhance public safety while balancing community values.

Lastly, I believe our community is our greatest asset. No amount of technology, training, or policy can replace looking out for our families, friends, and neighbors. Strong communities are built by people who know one another, care for one another, and work together. That has always been one of Maple Bluff's greatest strengths.



August 11th Election

This will be a Primary Election for Governor, Lieutenant Governor, Attorney General, Secretary of State, State Treasurer, Representative in Congress District 2, Representative to the Assembly District 76, County Sheriff, and Clerk of Circuit Court. In a Primary Election, voters can only vote for candidates in one political party. Candidates receiving the most votes within each political party will appear on the November 3rd ballot.

Voter Registration – Check your registration status at myvote.wi.gov. If you need to register or change your registration information, please visit the Village Center during business hours or register and vote on Election Day. You will need to provide Proof of Residence to register.

Absentee Voting (by mail) Request your ballot now at myvote.wi.gov. The deadline to request a mailed ballot is August 6th at 5pm. Voted ballots can be returned by mail (allow extra time) or dropped off at the Village Center (the drop box can be used after hours). Ballots must be returned by the voter and received before 8pm on Election Day.

Absentee Voting (in person) July 28th – August 7th, during office hours of 8am – 4pm Monday – Thursday and Friday (8/7 only) 8am – 5pm. Location - Village Center, 18 Oxford Place. Photo ID is required.

Election Day – Bring your photo ID and vote at the Village Center from 7:00am – 8:00pm on August 11th!

Did you know you can become a local Election Official?

Citizen involvement is essential to conduct open, fair, impartial and trusted elections in Wisconsin and one of the most rewarding ways to become involved in the election process is to become an Election Day Poll Worker. Poll Workers facilitate the right to vote and maintain order at the polls on Election Day. The Village of Maple Bluff is always looking for citizens interested in becoming an Election Day Poll Worker.

To be a poll worker, a person must:

- Be a qualified elector of the county in which the municipality is located (i.e., an adult citizen of the United States who has resided in the election district for 28 consecutive days and is not otherwise disqualified to vote)
- Be able to read and write fluently in the English language
- NOT be a candidate for any office to be voted on at the polling place at that election.

Poll workers do everything from check-in voters, help people register to vote, check photo IDs and process absentee ballots. You will be provided paid training prior to election day for the job you will be doing.

Working Election Day, you may select the shift that is most desirable to you.

- AM shift (6:30am-1:00pm)
- PM shift (1:00pm - 5:00pm)
- Evening shift (5:00pm - 9:00pm)
- All Day, or
- Whenever is needed.

Positions available are Election Official at \$12/hr and Chief Inspector at \$16/hr.

Preparing for What's Next

Throughout this summer, we've continued making progress on several important initiatives that share a common purpose: preparing Maple Bluff for the future while preserving the character and quality of life that make our community special. As we have progressed, one thing has become increasingly clear: Maple Bluff does not exist in isolation. The continued growth and redevelopment occurring around our Village, coupled with recent public safety events in neighboring communities, remind us that the environment in which we operate is constantly evolving. While Maple Bluff remains a safe and exceptional community, it is our responsibility to anticipate change rather than simply react to it.

Recent events in Madison have prompted many thoughtful conversations about public safety. Like many of you, I have reflected on what those events mean for our community and what we can continue doing to protect our residents, visitors, and the dedicated professionals who serve them.

I believe the Maple Bluff Police Department is stronger today than at any point in recent memory. We have assembled an experienced, professional team committed to serving this community with integrity, sound judgment, and compassion. At the same time, our size presents unique challenges. Officers frequently respond to calls alone, making strong training, sound policies, modern equipment, and regional partnerships especially important. We will continue investing in our people, body-worn cameras, public safety technology, and emerging tools that improve officer safety, transparency, and service to our community. No single policy or technology can eliminate risk, but thoughtful, continuous improvement helps us better prepare for whatever tomorrow may bring.

That same commitment to long-term preparedness extends across every Village department.

This month, we look forward to welcoming two new Assistant Fire Chiefs as Chief Nelson continues building the next generation of leadership within our Fire and EMS Department. One of our new Assistant Fire Chiefs joins us as a licensed paramedic, while the other will begin paramedic training upon joining the Village. These investments strengthen an already outstanding department while expanding our ability to provide the highest level of emergency medical care to our residents.

The Village Board also recently confirmed Paul Elliott as our new Director of Public Works following the announced retirement of longtime Director Tom Schroeder. Paul has faithfully served Maple Bluff for many years and has worked closely alongside Tom in preparation for this transition. We are now beginning an internal promotional process for the Foreman position while recruiting our next Public Works team member. This deliberate succession planning reflects one of the central priorities of our Strategic Plan: developing future leaders, preserving institutional knowledge, and ensuring continuity of service for years to come.

Strategic planning continues to move from ideas into implementation. We continue making progress on updated financial policies that will strengthen long-term budgeting and financial planning, workforce development initiatives across multiple departments, coordination with the City of Madison on the Gateway Corridor, and strengthening relationships with regional partners. While many of these efforts occur behind the scenes, they help ensure the Village remains financially sound, operationally resilient, and well-positioned to meet future challenges.

The proposed Maple Bluff Country Club improvements also continue to receive careful review. Staff, legal counsel, consultants, and the Village Board remain focused on ensuring the Board has the information necessary to fulfill its responsibilities under the lease before any decisions are made. I appreciate the patience, engagement, and thoughtful input residents have provided throughout this process.

As always, I remain grateful for the opportunity to serve this remarkable community. Maple Bluff's greatest strength has never been its buildings, roads, or equipment,... it has always been its people. By continuing to invest in our staff, planning thoughtfully for the future, and working together as a community, I am confident we will preserve what makes Maple Bluff special while preparing for the opportunities and challenges that lie ahead.

Maple Bluff Fire Rescue

Response Information

During July, our crews maintained an average response time of 3 minutes and 19 seconds, reflecting consistent readiness across both fire and EMS calls. So far this year, we've responded to 102 incidents, covering a wide range of emergencies.

Personnel

We're excited to welcome several new faces into the department. In July we welcomed the last two interns joining us, each bringing a different level of experience and certification, but all sharing a strong interest in our well established 2-year Internship program. Maple Bluff Fire Rescue staffs eight internship positions annually, with four positions designated for first-year interns and four positions designated for second-year interns.

Training

Throughout July, Maple Bluff Fire Rescue will conduct comprehensive Fire and EMS training aimed at preparing



new interns for successful integration into the department. Training will emphasize firehouse operations, emergency response, teamwork, safety, and the professional expectations of serving as a member of MBFD.

Public Outreach

Concerts in the Park are now underway, stop on by the Fire Departments Association beverage tent for a nice cool refreshment as you enjoy the music and to meet our firefighters, see our equipment up close, and learn more about the services we provide. We appreciate the continued support from the community and look forward to another safe, busy, and enjoyable summer here in Maple Bluff.

Recycling Matters - Let's Do Our Part

Recycling is one of the easiest ways we can all help protect our environment and reduce the amount of waste sent to landfills. There are many items that belong in your trash, but there are also many materials that should never be thrown away. As a country, as a state, and as a Village, we all have a responsibility to do a better job of recycling materials that are banned from Wisconsin landfills.

Here are a few helpful reminders:

- **Cardboard:** Clean cardboard can be recycled as long as it is free of grease, oil, or food residue.
- **Plastics:** Plastic containers marked with recycling symbols **#1 through #7** can be placed in your recycling cart. Please make sure they are empty before recycling.
- **Packing Materials:** Foam packaging, Styrofoam, packing peanuts, bubble wrap, and similar materials **cannot** be recycled through your curbside recycling program and should be placed in your trash.
- **Electronics:** Electronics are **banned from Wisconsin landfills** and should never be placed in your trash cart. If your electronics are still in working condition, consider donating them. If not, the Village offers electronic recycling collection for a fee based on the type of item. Please visit the Village website or contact the Village office for a current list of accepted items and applicable fees.
- **Metal Items:** Large metal items such as patio furniture, grills, lawn mowers, and similar scrap metal should not be placed in your trash cart. The Village collects these items separately using a pickup truck. Most items require a collection fee. Please contact the Village office for scheduling and pricing information.

Every item that is recycled properly helps conserve resources, reduces landfill waste, and keeps valuable materials in circulation. By taking a few extra moments to sort your recyclables correctly, you are helping keep our community clean and protecting the environment for future generations.

Update: MGE Electric Upgrade



Madison Gas and Electric (MGE) will be upgrading an additional section of the electric system in the Village of Maple Bluff to enhance service reliability, reduce outages, minimize tree trimming and prepare the area for the next generation of power delivery.

This work will involve replacing aging facilities and installing some new underground electric lines throughout the village as well as replacing or removing existing overhead power lines.

Construction activities will start in late August or early September 2026, and work is expected to take approximately six months to complete. The project will extend from Roxbury Road, north along Lakewood Boulevard and move west toward Magdeline Drive and Farwell Drive.

Why is this work needed?

Storms and wind can cause trees to fall or branches to bend or break into overhead electrical wires. Even small limbs that grow into and touch a high-voltage electric line can cause a short circuit, electrical outage or fire. Installing new underground high voltage electric lines in the area will enhance reliability and reduce the need for tree trimming. MGE also will be installing enhanced electric grid monitoring and control technology to help reduce the duration of storm-related outages when they do occur.

What does it mean for you?

You may soon see locators in the area marking and locating underground utilities and identifying available easements. Then, you will see MGE or contractor crews performing underground and overhead electric construction activity. MGE will keep the village updated as the project progresses.

After construction, crews will restore any disturbed areas to their preexisting state as weather permits.

Easement requests

Thank you to those residents who have signed easements, allowing this upgrade to move forward. Not all properties require an easement; the need for an easement is dependent on the location of the property and how it may be impacted by the project.
